#### 5C-4.0015 Definitions.

For the purposes of this chapter the following definitions shall apply:

(1) Accredited Veterinarian. A veterinarian licensed in the state of origin and accredited by the United States Department of Agriculture, Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (USDA, APHIS) to perform certain functions of the federal and cooperative-state-federal programs in accordance with the provisions of Title 9 Code of Federal Regulations 9 CFR §161.1 (JAN 2018), which is hereby incorporated by reference and available online at <u>http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-10035</u>.

(2) Animal(s). This term shall include: be as defined in Section 585.01(10), F.S., which provides that the term "animal" shall include wild or game animals whenever necessary to effectively control or eradicate dangerour transmissible diseases or pets which threaten the agricultural interests of the state.

(3) Authorized Representative. An employee of the state or federal government, or a licensed veterinarian accredited by the USDA, who is authorized to conduct animal disease control and eradication activities.

(4) Commercial Production Swine. Swine that have been subjected to and found negative on their most recent annual brucellosis and pseudorabies tests and have been continuously managed with adequate facilities and practices to prevent exposure to any transitional or feral swine and so recognized by state animal health officials.

(5) "Domestic animal" shall include any equine or bovine animal, goat, sheep, swine, domestic cat, dog, poultry, ostrich, emu, rhea, or other domesticated beast or bird.

(6) Exhibition. Any premises displaying or presenting livestock to the general public for an animal exhibit or animal show at an event sponsored by the state or county.

(7) Group. One or more Animals maintained on the same premises or in contact with one another.

(8) Horse. Any horse, mule, ass, zebra or other equidae.

(9) Isolation. Separation of individual Animals by a physical barrier in a manner that assures one Animal does not have access to the body, excrement, or discharges of another Animal; does not share a building with a common ventilation system; and is not within ten feet of another Animal.

(10) "Livestock" means grazing animals, such as cattle, horses, sheep, swine, goats, other hoofed animals, ostriches, emus, and rheas which are raised for private use or commercial purposes.

(11) Market Class. An exhibition class consisting of finished fed Animals that are isolated and housed seperately from all Animals not designated for slaughter immediately following the exhibition.

(12) Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (OCVI). A legible record or certificate made on an official form from the state of origin or from the USDA, or a Department-approved electronic format, issued and signed by veterinarians licensed and accredited in the state of origin for the purpose of certifying the Official Individual Identification, test requirements, and health status of specific Animals for movement, exhibition, and other designated purposes.

(13) Official Individual Identification. An individual Animal identification that uniquely identifies the Animal, the owner, the premises where the Animal was identified and the state in which the Official Individual Identification was applied and:

(a) For Cattle:

1. Is approved by the United States Department of Agriculture in accordance with 9 C.F.R. §86.4(a)(1) (2013), as incorporated in Rule 5C-31.006, F.A.C.; or

2. Is submitted to and verified by the Department as meeting the requirements for Official Individual Identification such that state officials can determine the herd in which the Animal was officially identified.

(b) For Livestock Other than Cattle:

1. Tattoos and registered brands such as ear, tail-web or flank tattoos, breed registration tattoos when accompanied by breed registration papers; or an official breed registration brand when accompanied by a brand registration certificate;

2. Official leg or wing bands for poultry;

3. Color digital images or notarized color photographs of the Animal, signed by an Accredited Veterinarian; or

4. Implanted electronic chips with a unique number that is recorded in a single, central database.

(14) Official test. A test conducted by a method approved by Department rules for the specific disease and Animal species.

(15) Poultry, Domestic Fowl or Ratites. Chickens, turkeys, quail, pheasants, chukars, peafowl, guineas, ratites (limited to ostriches, emus and rheas) and waterfowl that are propagated or maintained for commercial or breeding purposes.

(16) Segregated. To maintain a Group of Animals separate from another Group of Animals in such a manner as to prevent physical contact between Animals of the two Groups.

#### 5C-4.0016 Applications, Cards, Forms, Other Official Documents Required and Fees.

(1) USDA. Equine Infectious Anemia Laboratory Test VS Form 10-11 (MARCH 2014). An official USDA, APHIS, VS form required for submitting samples and reporting results of Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) tests. Equine Infectious Anemia Laboratory Test VS Form 10-11 (MARCH 2014) is hereby incorporated by reference and can be found online at <a href="http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-10036">http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-10036</a>.

(2) Division.

(a) Official Certificates of Veterinary Inspection (OCVI). These certificates are provided only to Florida-licensed Accredited Veterinarians and may be obtained as provided in subparagraph 5C-4.0016(2)(a)1., F.A.C. Depending on species and purpose (sale or movement), the following are Florida-recognized OCVIs:

1. Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, FDACS-09000 Rev. 06/17; for use with all species, in association with movement or sale. Cost is \$65 per book of 25 certificates. Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, FDACS-09000 Rev. 06/17 is incorporated by reference in Rule 5C-24.003, F.A.C.

2. Official Equine Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, FDACS-09002 Rev. 04/17; for use with equine, in association with movement or sale. Cost is \$65 per book of 25 certificates. Official Equine Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, FDACS-09002 Rev. 04/17 is incorporated by reference in Rule 5C-24.003, F.A.C.

(b) Equine Interstate Passport Card, FDACS-09207 Rev. 08/18 is incorporated by reference in subsection 5C-3.003(5), F.A.C., is an official card provided by the Department to the Horse owner, which certifies the existence of an official negative EIA test within the previous 12 months and a valid Florida Official Equine Certificate of Veterinary Inspection for interstate movement for exhibition purposes in states which accept the card. The document is valid for six (6) months provided the conditions in paragraphs 5C-3.003(5)(a)-(f), F.A.C., are met. The Equine Interstate Passport Card is not acceptable for change of ownership purposes. It may be applied for by submitting an Application for Equine Interstate Passport Card, FDACS-09219 Rev. 12/09, to the Division with the associated fee of \$15.00 for the first equine and \$5.00 for each additional equine on the same application. Application for Equine Interstate Passport Card, FDACS-09219 Rev. 12/09, to Equ

(c) Negative EIA Test Verification Card, FDACS-09160 Rev. 08/18, is an official document provided by the Department to the Horse owner to show proof of a negative EIA test within the previous 12 months, for purposes other than change of ownership. The document is valid for 12 months from the date the blood was drawn and is renewable annually with an associated fee of \$5.00 per application (Card). The Negative EIA Test Verification Card may be applied for by submitting the Application for Negative EIA Test Verification Card Test Verification Card FDACS-09160 Rev. 08/18 is hereby incorporated by reference and can be found online at <a href="http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-10037">http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-10037</a>. (d) Equine Event Extension, FDACS-09051 Rev. 03/06, an official document provided by the Department to the Horse owner, which certifies the existence of an official negative EIA test within the previous 12 months and a valid Florida Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection. Equine Event Extension, FDACS-09051 Rev. 03/06 is incorporated by reference in subsection 5C-3.003(5), F.A.C. The document is valid for six (6) months provided the conditions in paragraphs 5C-3.003(5)(a)-(f), F.A.C., are met. It may be applied for by submitting the Application for Equine Event Extension, FDACS-09078 Rev. 09/17, to the Division as referred to in subsection 5C-3.003(5), F.A.C., with the associated fee of \$10.00 for the first equine and \$5.00 for each additional equine on the application: Application for Equine Event Extension, FDACS-09078 Rev. 09/17, is hereby incorporated by reference in paragraph 5C-3.003(5)(e), F.A.C.

#### 5C-4.0017 General Requirements, Exemptions and Limitations.

(1) Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (OCVI) Required. Animals presented for exhibition purposes in Florida, unless specifically exempted, must be accompanied by an OCVI issued by a veterinarian accredited in the state of origin.

(a) The OCVI must be complete including the breed, sex, and registration number, and the Official Individual Identification of each Animal.

(b) Results of a specific test requirement or herd accreditation, certification or validation number for each Animal must be recorded on the OCVI with the date of the test or herd accreditation, certification or validation.

(2) Expiration of Required OCVI.

(a) For Florida-origin Animals an OCVI is valid for 90 days from the date of issue; or until the expiration date of any required tests, whichever is the earliest date.

(b) For Animals imported into Florida for exhibition purposes only, the OCVI is valid for 30 days, except that, for an equine imported into Florida using a current Equine Interstate Passport Card, FDACS-09207 Rev. 07/05, or equivalent from the state of origin signed by the State Veterinarian or chief animal health official, the OCVI will be extended to the date of expiration of the Equine Interstate Passport Card or its equivalent of the state of origin.

(3) Exemption to Required OCVI. An OCVI is not required for Animals originating in Florida and entered in Market Classes provided that Animals are Segregated from other Animals and the pens are occupied only by the Animals in a Market Class. Pens used for Market Classes must not be reused until after cleaning and disinfecting.

(4) Inspection Required. Prior to immediate acceptance at an exhibition, all animals presented for exhibition must be visually inspected by an Authorized Representative for:

(a) The required Official Individual Identification of the Animal; and

(b) Clinical signs of disease including, but not limited to: caseous lymphadenitis, blisters/ulcers around the mouth, nostrils, coronary band, pinkeye, pox, scabies, lice, ringworm, atrophic rhinitis, or multiple warts that are clearly visible; and

(c) Evidence of compliance with Animal tests and OCVI requirements, where required.

(5) Animals Rejected for Exhibition.

(a) Any Animal in noncompliance with Animal tests and OCVI requirements, or

(b) Any Animal not meeting the Official Individual Identification requirements, or

(c) Any Animal which is suspected of having or showing clinical signs of dangerous transmissible, contagious or infectious disease on visual inspection, or any Animal which is known to be exposed to such diseases must be:

1. Immediately withdrawn from exhibition and returned to the place of origin, or

2. Examined by a Florida-licensed Accredited Veterinarian at the owner's expense within 24 hours, who certifies by a signed, written statement, that the Animal is free of dangerous transmissible, contagious or infectious disease and pests.

#### 5C-4.001 General Requirements and Limitations.

#### 5C-4.002 Cattle or Bison.

(1) OCVI Required.

(a) Florida-origin cattle or bison moved for exhibition must be accompanied by an OCVI dated not more than 90 days prior to exhibition.

(b) Cattle or bison imported from other states for exhibition must be accompanied by an OCVI dated not more than 30 days prior to exhibition.

(2) Test or Certification Required.

(a) Tuberculosis.

1. Florida-origin cattle or bison may be entered for exhibition without a tuberculin test.

2. Imported dairy cattle may be entered for exhibition provided they have a negative caudal fold tuberculin skin test within 60 days prior to the date of the exhibition; except that, dairy cattle from an Accredited Herd as defined in Bovine Tuberculosis Eradication, APHIS 91-45-011 (Jan. 2005) and originating in Tuberculosis-Free States, are exempt from this test requirement. Bovine Tuberculosis Eradication, APHIS 91-45-011 (Jan. 2005) is hereby incorporated by reference and available online at http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-10086.

3. Imported beef cattle or bison may be entered for exhibition without a negative caudal fold tuberculin skin test provided they originate from Accredited Tuberculosis-Free States or Herds. Otherwise, they must meet the requirements in subparagraph 5C-4.002(2)(a)2., F.A.C.

(b) Brucellosis.

1. Test Required. Cattle or bison, six (6) months of age or older, must have evidence of a negative brucellosis test within 30 days prior to the date of exhibition.

2. Exemption from Required Brucellosis Test.

a. Steers and spayed heifers; and

b. Cattle or bison originating from a Certified Brucellosis-Free Herd as defined in 9 CFR §78.1 (JAN 2018), which is hereby incorporated by reference and available online at <u>http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-10040</u>, or a Brucellosis Class Free State or Area which when certified, the OCVI must show the certified herd number and the date of the last herd certification test; and

c. Cattle or bison from non-quarantined herds originating from Class A State or Area provided that the cattle are under 18 months of age.

#### 5C-4.003 Swine.

(1) OCVI Required.

(a) Swine for exhibition must be accompanied by an OCVI dated not more than 90 days prior to presentation for exhibition.

(b) Swine imported for exhibition must comply with the importation requirements set forth in Rule 5C-3.007, F.A.C.

(2) Tests or Certification Required for Breeding Swine.

(a) Brucellosis.

1. Swine imported for exhibition must comply with the importation requirements set forth in Rule 5C-3.007, F.A.C., Florida origin swine six (6) months of age or older must be negative to an official test for brucellosis within 90 days prior to exhibition, or

2. Originate from a Validated Brucellosis-Free Swine herd as defined in 9 CFR §78.1 (JAN 2018), which is incorporated by reference in Rule 5C-4.002, F.A.C., or

3. Originate from a Commercial Production Swine Herd as defined in subsection 5C-4.0015(4), F.A.C.

(b) Pseudorabies. Swine imported for exhibition must comply with the importation requirements set forth in Rule 5C-3.007, F.A.C. Florida origin swine six (6) months of age or older must be negative to an Official Test for pseudorabies within 90 days prior to exhibition, or

1. Originate from a Qualified Pseudorabies-Free Herd as defined in 9 CFR §85.1 (JAN 2018), which is incorporated by reference and available online at <a href="http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-10043">http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-10043</a>, or

2. Originate from an Approved Commercial Production Swine Herd as defined in Rule 5C-21.018, F.A.C.

(3) Exemptions. Swine for exhibition as Market Class swine are exempt from the OCVI and test requirements provided that all swine in the class go directly to slaughter following the exhibition.

(4) Isolation. Breeding swine returning to the farm from exhibitions must be Isolated from other swine for at least 30 days before being returned to the herd. Breeding swine for exhibition must be maintained in Isolation between exhibitions or move directly between exhibitions.

#### 5C-4.004 Poultry, Domestic Fowl or Ratites.

(1) OCVI Required. An OCVI is required for Poultry, Domestic fowl or Ratites for movement into Florida, but not specifically for exhibition. However, Poultry, Domestic fowl or Ratites presented for exhibition without an OCVI, must be inspected as provided in subsection 5C-4.0017(4), F.A.C.

(2) Test or Certification Required. All poultry or domestic fowl entered for exhibition must originate from Pullorum-Typhoid Clean flocks or hatcheries, as provided in 9 CFR §145 (Jan. 2018) and §147 (Jan. 2018), or have a negative pullorum-typhoid test within 90 days prior to exhibition. 9 CFR §145 (Jan. 2018) and §147 (JAN 2018) are hereby incorporated by reference and available online at <a href="http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-10045">http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-10045</a>.

#### 5C-4.005 Goats or Sheep.

(1) OCVI Required.

(a) Florida-origin goats or sheep presented for exhibition must be accompanied by an OCVI dated not more than 90 days prior to presentation, except lamb or kids less than three months of age and accompanied by their dam.

(b) Goats or sheep imported into Florida for exhibition must be accompanied by an OCVI completed within 30 days prior to exhibition.

(2) Identification. All goats or sheep entered for exhibition purposes must have an Official Individual Identification in accordance with the Scrapie Eradication Uniform Methods and Rules, APHIS 91-55-079, June 1, 2005, except lambs or kids under three months of age with offical identification as defined in paragraph 5C-4.0015(13)(b), F.A.C., or accompanied by their dam. Scrapie Eradication Uniform Methods and Rules, APHIS 91-55-079, June 1, 2005, is hereby incorporated by reference and available online at <a href="http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-10161">http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-10161</a>.

(3) Test or Certification Required.

(a) Tuberculosis Test. All dairy goats six (6) months of age or older imported for exhibition purposes must originate from an Accredited Tuberculosis-Free Herd as defined in 9 CFR §77.5 (Jan. 2018), or have had a negative caudal fold tuberculosis test within 90 days prior to exhibition. When originating from Accredited Tuberculosis-Free Herds, the OCVI must show, the accredited herd number and the date of the last herd accreditation test.

(b) Brucellosis Test. All dairy goats six (6) months of age or older imported for exhibition purposes must originate from a Certified Brucellosis-Free Herd as defined in 9 CFR §78.1 (Jan. 2018), or have had a negative brucellousis test within 90 days prior to exhibition. When originating from a Certified Brucellosis-free herd, the OCVI must show the certified herd number and the date of the last herd certification test. Bovine Tuberculosis Eradication, APHIS 91-45-011 (JAN 2005) is hereby incorporated by reference in subparagraph 5C-4.002(2)(a)2., F.A.C.

(c) Exemption From Test Requirements. There are no tuberculosis or brucellosis test requirements for meat type goats or Florida-origin dairy goats.

(e) A Negative EIA Test Verification Card, FDACS-09160 Rev. 07/05, or equivalent of the state of origin signed by the State Veterinarian or chief animal health official; which may be applied for by submitting the Application for Negative EIA Test Verification Card, FDACS-09206 Rev. 10/05, or

(f) A Department-approved electronic EIA form containing clear, color digital images.

(3) Exemption to Test Requirement. A foal under six (6) months of age accompanied by its dam which has met the EIA test requirement is not required to have an EIA test.

# NATIONAL CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS IAFE (INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FAIRS AND EXPOSITIONS)

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times conduct themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to the "IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics," fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial and national levels.

All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

- 1. All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.
- 2. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.
- 3. Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.
- 4. Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of drugs. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer and/or absolutely responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event, which culminates with the animal entering the food chain, shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state and provincial statues, regulations and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state and provincial statues, regulations and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event.

If the laboratory report on the chemical analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood, or other substance tested (by the approved laboratory to which it is sent) is the one taken from the animal in question. Its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise at any hearing in regard to the matter conducted by the fair or livestock show.

At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.

- 5. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, conformation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.
- 6. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.

### SIGNATURES REQUIRED ON THE BACK OF THIS FORM!

7. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair, or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of

their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation, and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.

- 8. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.
- 9. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.
- 10. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to have any disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show against such individuals published in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including *Fairs and Expositions* and any special notices to members.
- 11. The act of entering an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the AFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state, or provincial statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.

- 1. The Osceola County Fair & Livestock Show does not take responsibility for lost, damaged or misdirected forms, entries or articles of exhibit.
- 2. All rules are subject to the interpretation of the Board of Directors of the Fair. All decisions made by the Board are final. This Board reserves the right to deny or allow any entry to the Fair and Fairgrounds.
- 3. All non-commercial exhibits must check in according to committee guidelines as published. No exhibit may leave the grounds prior to the scheduled release dates & times as indicated in the various calendars and/or individual department or section rules.
- 4. In all events and exhibits being judged, the judge's decision shall be final.
- 5. All entries, if not claimed by close of check out time shall become the property of the Fair. All premiums will be paid and checks mailed within 6 weeks after the fair ends. Premium checks MUST be cashed within 60 days of the issue date.
- 6. A \$30.00 fee or 5% of the face amount will be charged for any bad check received by the Fair for entries, animal sales, sponsorships, contracts, etc.
- 7. Any formal complaints shall be presented in writing within six (6) hours of the discrepancy to the Fair Office to be handled as they see fit.
- 8. Any exhibitor or vendor conducting or participating in any illegal or immoral activities on the Fairgrounds shall forfeit all rights to display at the Fair and will lose any monies owed or paid by/to the Fair for premiums, sales, privilege agreements, etc.
- 9. If these rules contradict any committee rule(s) the committee rule(s) shall prevail.
- 10. By signing any privilege agreement, license, entry form, etc., participant agrees to release and discharge the Kissimmee Valley Livestock Show & Fair, Inc. and the Board of Directors & staff thereof from all liabilities, claims, and demands of whatever kind or nature that may arise from or be connected with the participant's participation in any activity sponsored by Kissimmee Valley Livestock Show & Fair, Inc.

# ELIGIBILITY:

• Exhibitor must be 8 years old by **September 1**, **prior to fair.** Exhibitor must be a current member of Osceola County 4-H, FFA, or FCCLA and may enter all open class shows.

### HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:

- All animals will be required to meet the guidelines set by the State of Florida, Department of Agriculture.
- **DO NOT** bathe any animals in the wash stations or use water for animals for drinking from the wash stations. Please use the designated water spicket/hose for water of all animals.

## **TRANSPORTATION OF ANIMALS:**

• All Poultry animals must be transported in an animal safe carrier or cage to and from the fair.

### JUDGING:

- Only Blue-Ribbon exhibits will be eligible for Best in Class, Grand Champion and Reserve Champion places. Exhibitors must be present during judging or prior arrangements must be made with the committee, otherwise no premiums will be paid. An animal can only be shown in one class.
- Birds are judged according to the American Poultry Association (APA) Standard of Perfection and the American Bantam Association (ABA) of Perfection. Birds recognized by the ABA will be placed in classifications of the APA. Birds not currently recognized as a breed by these Associations can be still be shown in Grooming or Commercial Classes.
- Exhibitors are <u>NOT PERMITTED</u> to give <u>ANYTHING</u> to any judges or act as though they may give anything to any judges during any show.

# DRESS CODE:

- FOR THE SHOW:
  - All exhibitors must wear a white, sleeved, collared dress shirt or blouse, tucked in with dark blue or black western trousers or western jeans.
  - Boots or leather closed toed shoes.
  - Exhibitors may wear a 4-H or FFA jacket. A 4-H or FFA tie may be worn if the exhibitor desires.
  - No other jackets, vests, or ties will be allowed.
- FOR SHOWMANSHIP/SALE:
  - All exhibitors must wear a long-sleeved shirt, collard dress shirt or blouse, tucked in with nice clean jeans or western dress trousers.
  - Boots or leather closed toes shoes.
  - Jackets, ties, vests, will be allowed.
  - THERE WILL BE NO EXCEPTIONS TO THIS RULE.

## AC/HEAT:

• There is no AC or Heat. **BLANKETS ON TOP OF CAGES** must be **REMOVED** by 10:00 AM or earlier if the fair opens before 10:00 AM. Blankets cannot be put on cages before 8:00 PM (this includes tarps). You may store them folded in the exhibitor feed area.

### SIGNAGE:

- ONLY SIGNAGE APPROVED BY THE FAIR OFFICE AND/OR COMMITTEES ARE PERMITTED ON CAGES OR PENS. Please see a Poultry Committee Member if you have any questions.
- FOR SALE signs may be placed on the cages the 2<sup>nd</sup> weekend of the fair, with pickup on Sunday at checkout time. Exhibitor must be present to release birds to the new owner(s).

## **REGISTRATION:**

- All animals must be registered **ONLINE**.
- All Exhibitors are required to have an Ethics Number. Please register online at<u>www.floridastatefairag.com/ethics</u>. You may take the Ethics Class at any location offered listed on the Florida State Fair website. You must preregister for the ethics class online. Your Ethics Certificate will be valid for 3 Fair Seasons. (Not 3 calendar years)
- \*\*\* If unsure of breed/variety you may bring your bird to any of the workshops or contact the Chair or Co-Chair for assistance.
- MANDATORY PRE-FAIR WORKSHOP in January. All exhibitors are to attend to receive updated fair information and changes. YOUTH MUST ATTEND THE HANDS-ON BATHING/PEST CONTROL PORTION OF THE WORKSHOP IN JANUARY, if they have not previously done so (see calendar for exact dates & times). Hands on portion will begin right after the Pre-Fair portion. Please bring one bird per family and any grooming materials for hands on workshop. ANY QUESTIONS PLEASE CONTACT THE POULTRY CHAIR OR CO-CHAIR.
- In the event, *you need to change your entry*, you must *email the chairperson no later than January 22, 2022*
- Parent & youth will need to sign the acknowledgement form that will be emailed after confirmation is receive that entries are correct. Both the parent and the youth are to read, fill out and sign the form per exhibitor. Bring filled out form to check in. If the form is not brought to check in, then the parent and exhibitor will be required to read and sign the acknowledgement form prior to your animal(s) checking in (a separate table will be set up to speed up check in)
- Any person who violates any Local, State or Department rule or displays unethical conduct will forfeit all privileges and premiums and be subject to such penalty as the Kissimmee Valley Livestock Show and Fair Board may order.
- If at judging, birds are found to be in wrong class, they will be moved to grooming. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

# ANIMAL CARE:

- Exhibitors will be required to feed and water their own animals and bring their OWN feeders, waterers, and feed. All animals must be cared for by the exhibitor. This includes feeding, watering, and cleaning beds and pens. Exhibitors will need to bring feed each day for their animals. \*\*Please DO NOT feed anyone else's bird. Not all birds are on same type of food or feeding schedule. \* DO NOT use anyone else's food. They did not bring extra to feed yours.
- Any feed or equipment left in the feed area are at the owners' own risk. The Fair, the Fair Board, or Poultry Committee are not responsible for missing, broken, or left behind items.
- All Poultry animals must be transported in an animal safe carrier or cage to and from the fair.
- The use of any unlabeled products is not permitted at the fair.
- The use of any sprays or chemicals are <u>NOT PERMITTED</u> to be used in or around the cages.
- It is not the responsibility of the KVLS Committee to feed and/or water animals.
- If an exhibitor fails to feed and/or water their animals for 24 hours the exhibitor will be asked to remove their animal.
- Please clean out **cages daily** and **rake** under pens daily. Please DO NOT put plastic down under the mulch. Remove the mulch as needed (does not need to be removed daily unless very messy-typically about 2-3 days) Be sure mulch in good condition on show day. Remember these exhibits are for the public to view, let's show them something we can be proud of.
- USED MULCH IS TO BE TAKEN BEHIND THE BARN TO THE DESIGNATED AREA. DO NOT put the used mulch with the new mulch that is located outside the tents.
- Both adults & youth are to sign in and out of tent each time you go into feed, water, clean, barn duty, or anytime you spend time in the tent. Sign in sheet must be signed by the youth and parent on separate lines. Please DO NOT sign in a child/or child that is/are not present at the time. Youth will need to sign in for themselves or no credit will be given.

### HANDLING:

- No animal will be exhibited in competition that cannot be properly handled by the exhibitor.
- Animals that cannot be handled properly will be disqualified and premiums forfeited.

### SHOW LIMITATION:

• There must be a minimum of five animals per species to have a show (unless otherwise stated).

### CHECKIN:

- Youth and adults are not to move birds from the assigned cages.
- On Friday, early morning the Poultry Committee will move birds to be in the correct breed section and to condense cage space. If you wish to move your own bird, you will need to be present when we move the birds.
- Eggs will be collected by the Poultry Committee at various times during the day and will be disposed of at the discretion of the fair. SORRY NO EGGS WILL BE LEFT IN THE CAGES.

Hands on portion will begin right after the Pre-Fair portion. Please bring one bird per family and any grooming materials for hands on workshop. ANY QUESTIONS PLEASE CONTACT THE POULTRY CHAIR OR CO-CHAIR.
- If a bird gets sick during the fair, please notify a committee member. They will notify the Chair or Co-Chair. Only persons authorized to send a bird home sick and not forfeit premiums are the Chair, Co-Chair, or a veterinarian (written proof to be provided to fair office). We do not want sick animals at the fair nor do we want you to lose your premiums.

# Animal Eligibility:

- Birds need to be at least 6 months old or older by fair check-in date. **Exhibitors** will need to be able to handle their birds.
- No classes are provided for Guineas or Peacocks.

# Entries Allowed:

• A total of six (6) birds allowed per exhibitor. May enter three (3) in addition if part of the Production Poultry Program.

### Judging:

## **Entry Forms:**

• Entries will be accepted online ONLY. Be sure you are entering in the correct size bantam or Standard/Large Fowl, duck/geese by weight size, turkeys, or Misc. (quail). Include the variety/color. \*\*\*If unsure you may bring bird(s) to any of the workshops or contact the Chair or Co-Chair for assistance.

### Feeding:

- **Cups will be NOT provided for food or water**. Exhibitor must bring a large waterer and a heavy food dish (so they don't tip over easily. It is recommended the waterers be attached to the side of the pen using the Soda Pop Water Bottle Bird Drinker Cup or any bird container you can attach inside the cage, so they don't get knocked over. **ALL CONTAINTERS BROUGHT IN MUST BE CLEAN AND HAVE NO RUST. Questions please contact chair for more information.**
- **TRIOS, Ducks, Geese and Turkeys containers must be provided by owner**. Be sure containers are secure or designed so will not tip over.
- NO HAY IS ALLOWED IN THE PENS.
- **No Foam Boards allowed to separate birds**. Please DO NOT remove the dividers from between cages.
- A roost or small carpet will be permitted as long as the pen is kept clean **DAILY**. If not done so, items will be removed & discarded
- Both adults & youth are to sign in and out of tent each time you go into feed, water, clean, barn duty, or anytime you spend time in the tent. \*\*Must be signed by the youth and parent on separate lines. Please <u>DO NOT</u> sign in a child/or child that is/are not present at the time. Youth will need to sign in for themselves or no credit will be given.
- \*\*Please DO NOT feed anyone else's bird. Not all birds are on same type of food or feeding schedule. **DO NOT** use anyone else's feed. They did not bring extra to feed yours.

- The chicks will be handed out at KVLS **on** 8/21/2021 AT 4:00PM. The Poultry Workshop is scheduled for **September 25, 2021.** Sign in is at 8:30 am for all. - Extra points earned for barn duty of minimum of 2 hours at a time. (No points given if work 1 hr 59 minutes sorry).
- Extra points can also be earned by doing a proper demonstration on poultry.
  - All demonstrations must be a PROPER DEMONSTRATION and will be monitored by committee member or someone appointed by the Committee Chair. Each demonstration to be 5-10 minutes long each in front of the committee member monitoring the demonstration.
  - Sign up available at check-in only. Available date(s)/time(s) will be listed. Once a time slot is filled it is closed. If you come at a time that is closed and time allows, you may do a demonstration.
  - Maximum demonstrations allowed is two (2) must be different. \*\*5 points per demonstration.
- Points are earned and tabulated with highest two (2) scores will receive
  - Master Exhibitor-\$50 and a BELT BUCKLE
  - Reserve Master Exhibitor-\$25 and a MEDALLION.
- Each section gets points; a percentage of the points is used towards the total accumulated points:
- Those who do 2 hours at a time of barn duty will receive EXTRA POINTS towards Master Exhibitor.

# **Good Neighbor Award**

- Barn Duty-time is calculated by signing in & out. Barn Duty is taken into consideration for the GOOD NEIGHBOR AWARD but is NOT based on that only. Those who do 2 hours at a time of barn duty will receive EXTRA POINTS towards Master Exhibitor.
- Barn Duty time is also used for community service hours for the youth.
- Additional criteria for the GOOD NEIGHBOR AWARD:
  - Points are earned when an individual *assists with tent set up prior to fair and/or check in day.*
  - An individual who has shown an outstanding attitude of helpfulness.
  - Is focused on going out of their way to help their neighbor.
  - Pitching in to assist in the tent to keep it clean and presentable for each other and the public.
  - MENTORING to the less experienced exhibitors.
