NATIONAL CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS IAFE (INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FAIRS AND EXPOSITIONS)

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times conduct themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show.h addition to the "IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics," fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial and national levels.

All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

- 1. All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.
- 2. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.
- 3. Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.
- 4. Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of drugs. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer and/or absolutely responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event, which culminates with the animal entering the food chain, shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state and provincial statues, regulations and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state and provincial statues, regulations and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event.

If the laboratory report on the chemical analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood, or other substance tested (by the approved laboratory to which it is sent) is the one taken from the animal in question. Its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise at any hearing in regard to the matter conducted by the fair or livestock show.

At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.

- 5. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, conformation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.
- 6. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.

SIGNATURES REQUIRED ON THE BACK OF THIS FORM!

7. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair, or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. h the furtherance of

their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation, and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.

- 8. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.
- 9. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.
- 10. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to have any disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show against such individuals published in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including *Fairs and Expositions* and any special notices to members.
- 11. The act of entering an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the AFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state, or provincial statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.

OSCEOLA COUNTY FAIR & LIVESTOCK SHOW GUIDELINES FOR EXHIBITION

- 1. The Osceola County Fair & Livestock Show does not take responsibility for lost, damaged or misdirected forms, entries or articles of exhibit.
- 2. All rules are subject to the interpretation of the Board of Directors of the Fair. All decisions made by the Board are final. This Board reserves the right to deny or allow any entry to the Fair and Fairgrounds.
- 3. All non-commercial exhibits must check in according to committee guidelines as published. No exhibit may leave the grounds prior to the scheduled release dates & times as indicated in the various calendars and/or individual department or section rules.
- 4. In all events and exhibits being judged, the judge's decision shall be final.
- 5. All entries, if not claimed by close of check out time shall become the property of the Fair. All premiums will be paid and checks mailed within 6 weeks after the fair ends. Premium checks MUST be cashed within 60 days of the issue date.
- 6. A \$30.00 fee or 5% of the face amount will be charged for any bad check received by the Fair for entries, animal sales, sponsorships, contracts, etc.
- 7. Any formal complaints shall be presented in writing within six (6) hours of the discrepancy to the Fair Office to be handled as they see fit.
- 8. Any exhibitor or vendor conducting or participating in any illegal or immoral activities on the Fairgrounds shall forfeit all rights to display at the Fair and will lose any monies owed or paid by/to the Fair for premiums, sales, privilege agreements, etc.
- 9. If these rules contradict any committee rule(s) the committee rule(s) shall prevail.
- 10. By signing any privilege agreement, license, entry form, etc., participant agrees to release and discharge the Kissimmee Valley Livestock Show & Fair, Inc. and the Board of Directors & staff thereof from all liabilities, claims, and demands of whatever kind or nature that may arise from or be connected with the participant's participation in any activity sponsored by Kissimmee Valley Livestock Show & Fair, Inc.

ELIGIBILITY:

- Exhibitor must be a current member of Osceola County 4-H, FFA, or FCCLA.
- Junior Exhibitor (8-10), Intermediate Exhibitor (11-13), Senior Exhibitor (14-18) years of age as of September 1st of current year.

REGISTRATION:

• All Exhibitors are required to register all entries online on the Fair Website; under YE PRIOR TO REGISTRATION DEADLINE.

IF YOU ARE ASKED TO PAY YOU ARE NOT IN YOUTH EXHIBITS.

- Please ensure that you hit SUBMIT at the end of your entry so that you will receive a fair entry confirmation.
- Please print out your confirmation so you will have a record of your entries. This confirmation will be required at check in to confirm all entries.
- Additional entries will <u>not</u> be accepted.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:

- All animals are required to be free of disease, parasites, and mites.
- If not free of the listed above, they will be disqualified.
- All animals will be checked at check-in.

ANIMAL ELIGIBILITY:

- All small animals must be left in their own cages at the fair.
- ALL CAGES ARE REQUIRED TO HAVE A LOCK TO SECURE CAGE. This is for the protection of your animal. ALL AQUARIUMS ARE REQUIRED to have secure cover or ratchet lock.
- See small animal section or rabbit and poultry committee for rules and regulations.

NOTICE: KVLS IS NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR LOST, DAMAGE, OR STOLEN ITEMS REGISTERED FOR PUBLIC VIEW. ITEMS MAY BE BROKEN OR STOLEN WHILE AT FAIR.

CHECK-IN SATURDAY:

• All entries will be turned in on check in day except for Baked Goods, Small Animals and Horticulture. Check-in will be from 2-4 pm.

CHECK-IN THURSDAY:

- All Baked Goods, Horticulture and Small Animals will be checked in from 5-7 pm.
- Market Hog Exhibitors can check in from 1-3 to allow them time for their mandatory Hog Meeting.

JUDGING:

• Exhibitors must be present during judging of rabbits and poultry or prior arrangements must be made with the committee, otherwise no premiums will be paid.

PREMIUMS:

- ***ALL PREMIUMS ARE THE SAME UNLESS OTHERWISE NOTED IN SECTIONS***
- Ribbons:
 - 1st Blue \$5.00 | 2nd Red \$3.00 | 3rd White \$2.00
 - Best in Class (Pink) \$7.00 | Best in Show (Purple) \$25.00
 - Exhibitors will be paid the highest premium of award level
 - i.e., Best in class will receive \$7 total/ Best in show will receive \$25
 - To qualify for Best in Class, you must place with a Blue Ribbon.
- All premium checks will be mailed to the exhibitors after the fair.
- Please allow up to 6 weeks.
- Any exhibits **removed** before checkout time will forfeit their premium money unless prior arrangements have been made with Youth Exhibit Chair or Co-Chair.
- Any exhibits **NOT PICKED UP** during checkout time will forfeit their **PROJECT** unless previous arrangements have been made.
- Anyone can pick up your exhibits if they have your claim checks. They will be asked to sign for them.
- No Exhibits will be held in the Fair or Extension Services after checking out day.
- Any remaining items will be discarded unless prior arrangements have been made with the Youth Exhibit Chair.
- Grand Champion and Reserve Grand will be awarded on the first Sunday during the *Youth Exhibit Awards*, this ceremony will not include Share the Fun and Fashion Revue as those will be awarded at the time of the show.

*Best in Class and Best in Show will not be awarded to every class. These awards may be awarded based on number of entries and Judges discretion.

SECTION 1 | TABLETOPS

RULES:

- Each Osceola County 4-H, FFA or FCCLA member may enter THREE (3) CLASSES, BUT ONLY ONE (1) ENTRY PER CLASS.
- Exhibits will be judged on: originality, having 3-D, drawing attention, pleasing appearance and well planned (see example below.)
- Must demonstrate one main theme or idea and teach something about the project.
- 28X40 Maximum –
- Larger boards will be disqualified
- You may cut large boards in half.
- No live animals or insects allowed as part of a display.
- No flammable materials, ie. matches, lighters, etc.

- You must enter a new display each year. (Please add Name, Club or Chapter, Current Fair Year, Age and Phone Number on back of display).

SECTION 2 | SEWING, CROCHETING, NEEDLEWORK

RULES:

• Open to all Osceola County 4-H, FFA or FCCLA member may enter THREE (3) CLASSES, BUT ONLY ONE (1) ENTRY PER CLASS.

- All items must be made by exhibitor, after February 28th of previous year and not exhibited previously. Items must be <u>clean, pressed and in good condition.</u>
- All sewing items must be brought to the SATURDAY Youth Exhibit check-in from 2-4 pm.
- All construction must be completed by hand or use of a SEWING MACHINE.
- No tied blankets will be accepted.
- Pillows larger than 16" X 16" overall will not be accepted (suggestion: cut fabric 16x16 before sewing).

SECTION 3| BAKED GOODS

RULES:

- Open to all Osceola County 4-H, FFA or FCCLA member may enter THREE (3) CLASSES, BUT ONLY ONE (1) ENTRY PER CLASS.
- A recipe form is needed and is in **Forms** on the fair website **UNDER YOUTH EXHIBITS** and must be submitted with your entry.
- Recipe must be attached baked goods for judges. Please list ingredients and cooking information. Presentation box will be provided.
- All baked goods must be brought to the Thursday Youth Exhibit check-in from 5-7 pm.

GENERAL RULES:

- Items must be on/in DISPOSABLE CONTAINERS and require NO REFRIGERATION.
- Items must be cooked (except candy), must contain flour (except candy & gluten free recipes), and cannot use raw eggs in recipe or have meringue (all eggs must be cooked or baked into recipe).
- No "Friendship" bread or other products that are "aged" without refrigeration before baking. A minimum of five ingredients is required.
- A new recipe is required each year.
 - a. For example, if you made Grandma's chocolate cookies last year you cannot make them again this year.
- NO PRE-PACKAGED, BOXED PRODUCTS OR PREMADE INGREDIENTS MAY BE ENTERED (for example, no boxed cake mixes, frozen bread or pre-made pie crusts, etc.).

Must submit required quantity to qualify for judging AND label name of recipe on top of the provided container.

SECTION 4 | PHOTO EXHIBITION

Rules:

- All 4-H, FFA or FCCLA members may enter four (4) CLASSES, BUT ONLY ONE (1) ENTRY PER CLASS.
- Photographs cannot be dually entered into the same class.
- Photos must have provided description tags attached BEFORE check in. They are provided here to print.

Eligibility of Photos:

- All photographs must have been taken within one year of the date of the photo contest.
- <u>No subjects</u> under the age of 18 will be allowed unless faces cannot be seen.

Size of Photo:

• Photos submitted must be 8x10 and no larger. Mounted properly for an overall maximum size of 8" x 10".

Mounting of Photographs:

- All prints must be securely and permanently mounted on a non-frame board that may be of 5mm foam board or mat board no larger than photo.
- No framing (of any kind) is allowed.

Photo Story Class Submissions:

- A minimum of 3 photos to a maximum of 4 photos must be submitted individually in this class. Each photo must be 8x10 and no larger and individually mounted properly with at least one string, rope, cord or ribbon holding the photos in sequence. (May use two, string, rope, etc. for better mounting.
- All photos must be taken and mounted in the same direction. (All horizontal or all vertical).
- On the back of the photo on the label/ID tag, please outline the sequence of the photos and provide an explanation about your "Photo Story".
- <u>No subjects</u> under the age of 18 will be allowed within the story unless faces cannot be seen.

Refusal Rights:

- KVLS reserves the right to refuse inappropriate or unsuitable entries.
- Photograph must NOT be offensive, degrading, racists, or contain pornography of any form.

Alterations of Photo:

• Altered photography, such as changing colors or applying design styles, using computer graphics will disqualify an entry unless listed under Altered photo category.

PHOTOGRAPHY CONTEST OBJECTIVES:

• To develop photography skills in composition, light, story line, posing, and awareness.

PROPER LABELING OF PHOTOS:

• Each entry must include the Photo Label and can be added at check in.

DISQUALIFICATIONS OF ENTRIES:

• Entries that do not follow the rules, division and class guidelines or any general guidelines will automatically be disqualified.

CLASSES:

Animal

Animal life, including domestic, wild, insects and underwater creatures. The animal(s) should be the focus of the photo and not human subjects or nature/scenic. No harm or injury should be inflicted on the animal to acquire the photo.

Plant/Landscape

Any photo that focuses on the plant or flower, scene of natural landscapes.

- **PEN & INK** | Ink pens, including gel and ink paints, come in an array of colors including metallic,

fluorescent, glow-in-the-dark, and more.

- **PENCIL** | this class includes both colored and graphite pencils.
- **MARKER** | Markers contain a reservoir of soluble ink that is wicked onto a drawing or writing surface through a felt or nylon tip.
- **CRAYON** | this class includes chalk, conté crayons, grease crayon, charcoal, wax crayon, pastels, and litho.
- **ACRYLIC** | this class includes all techniques applied to acrylic paints.
- **SPECIAL EFFECTS** | this class includes collages, varnishes, gouache paint, oil paints, and other fine art mediums.
- COMPUTER ENHANCED | this class includes computer or machine drawn images, scrapbooking,

stencil letters, and foam letters.

Examples on how to apply one of the themes to a poster include:

Illustrations of youth preparing health meals, curriculum icons, people speaking about programs at a county commission meeting, individuals working with the rocketry curriculum, anti-smoking themes, youth in a leadership role, or exploring beekeeping as a hobby.

- Fashion Revue is open to all Osceola County 4-H, FFA, and FCCLA members, and is one (1) entry per person, per class.
- Youth participating in the Fashion Revue are encouraged to complete the appropriate project for their age.
- The outfit must be created, coordinated, and modeled by the exhibitor participant, with the exception of the *Sewing for Others* category.
- Outfits are subject to review for modesty and appropriate attire. Formalwear may be strapless or have spaghetti straps.
 - a. No backless dresses, excessive visible cleavage, visible undergarments, lingerie, or swimsuits will be allowed.
- Before and after photos of the participant **wearing** the garment is required of **ALL** participants in the Repurposed Category.
- Fashion Revue Construction Class focuses on building clothing construction skills.
- An entry may consist of an outfit of one or more sewn coordinated pieces.
- A sewing machine must be used for a majority of the construction.
- The exhibitor must do all construction.
- Garments must have been sewn since March 1st of the previous year.

WORKSHOPS REQUIRED:

WORKSHOP I - CONSTRUCTION JUDGING:

• Entries will be judged for construction, fit and accessory selection. Your Construction garment(s) must be left following the judging with the competed required data sheet attached.

SELECTION JUDGING:

• Entries will be judged on fit, poise and selection reasoning. The required data sheet must be presented at check in.

NOTE: Date sheet must be obtained from the Fair website. One data sheet for Construction and on date sheet for Selection.

WORKSHOP II – MODELING PRACTICE:

• You will be taught proper modeling techniques. This is a dress rehearsal. You must wear the complete garment that you will be wearing for Fashion Revue including accessories.

Model Judging will take place during dress rehearsal.

- This category will showcase the member's sewing skills and their ability to coordinate an outfit. As skill levels range from beginning to advance, entries in the Personally Sewn category will also vary. The entry might be a one-piece dress, or it might be three coordinated pieces.
- A sewn costume would be considered Personally Sewn category.

SEWING FOR OTHERS:

- Sewing for Others gives the sewer an opportunity to sew for another person. Both sewer and model must be available at all workshops and judging events to qualify for awards.
- This category will showcase the member's sewing skills and their ability to coordinate an outfit. Garment(s) must be sewn by the exhibitor and modeled by the person sewn for.
- You must show growth in your sewing abilities, advancing each year. You must make something different each year.

SELECTION:

• Garment can be chosen from previously purchased items as long as they are neat and clean, free from stains and/or tears, or can be purchased since the last year's Fashion Revue. This category demonstrates the ability to coordinate an outfit exhibiting positive consumer skills. Accessories are part of the overall look.

• Garments chosen should be something that you would wear every day or for a special occasion, i.e. Prom, or a special Party. (This does not include sports uniforms or costumes).

• *Clothing Selection* is a contest designed to encourage youth to use the clothing in their wardrobe to achieve a fashion look that is complementary to their age and body type.

• A selection entry can consist of an outfit of one or more coordinated pieces.

• Contestants will be required to tell judges why they have selected the outfit why the accessories were used and their part in achieving the fashion look.
