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General Fair Rules and Regulations

The General Rules and Regulations of the Fair will govern the overall operation of the fair. Each department will have specific rules outlined in their division catalog. Be sure to read the rules and regulations before entering or competing in any division and/or department.

- Division I: Competition is limited to residents of North Carolina.
- Make your entries early! The right is reserved to reject entries received after all available space is taken.
- **Online Entries Only!!** Be sure to fill in the online form completely and accurately.
 - All entries should be in the name of the entrant, not the parent or guardian.
 - Include the complete rural route number, post office box number, or city street address, zip code, and telephone number, including area code.
- NC Substitute W-9 Form All highlighted areas of the NC Substitute W-9 must be complete.
 - A new NC Substitute W-9 form must be completed annually.
 - \circ <u>The Social Security number must be that of the entrant not the parent or guardian.</u>
 - If premiums are to be paid to a school or club, please complete the NC Substitute W-9 with the organization's information.
 - Premiums will not be paid to exhibitors who choose not to disclose their full Social Security Number or Federal ID on the NC Substitute W-9 form at the time of registration.
- Awards in any department will be given only if merited.
- If an entry is misrepresented or the exhibitor misrepresents his/her status, the entry will be disqualified.
- All exhibits will be under the supervision and care of the NC Mountain State Fair.
 - Proper attention will be given to prevent theft or damage, but we assume no responsibility for damage or loss of personal property of the exhibitors.
- Premium checks will be issued from Raleigh. Please Allow up to 10 weeks for premium checks to be processed.
 - NO PREMIUMS WILL BE RELEASED WITHOUT A SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER OR TAX ID NUMBER PLACED ON NC SUBSTITUTE W-9 FORM. IF THE NUMBER LISTED ON THE ENTRY FORM DOES NOT MATCH THE NAME ON THE ENTRY FORM WHEN GIVEN TO THE IRS, YOU COULD BE SUBJECT TO IRS FINES.

Participation is Easy

- Enter Online before August 23, 2024, and print the entry form. (non-perishable items only)
- Bring your entries on or before August 23, 2024, 11:30 AM to your Local County Extension Office.
- Bring your non-perishable items to the Extension office, wrapped & packed securely for transport. Label your box with your name and county. Also include a completed entry form inside the box with your items.
- Your entries will be picked up in your county from the Extension Office & transported to the Mountain State Fair for judging and display.
- Only items picked up on the Pony Express route will be returned on Pony Express. No items will be added to the return list of items that are dropped off by the exhibitors at the fairgrounds after the Pony Express has run.
- Items will be returned to your local Extension Office after the fair by September 27th, 2024.
- Any prize money will be mailed directly to you. (Must provide Social Security number on a NC Substitute W-9 to receive payment.)

Heartbeat O' Fair Focus Exhibits and Exhibitors

- All exhibits must be officially entered in the Fair online before 11:55pm on Fri. August 23, 2024.
 - All entries must be the work of the exhibitor, produced September 2023 September 2024
 - The age on the entry is as of the first day of the fair.
 - Each exhibitor may make an entry in each class, except where indicated (e.g., Photography); no entry may be entered under more than one class.
 - Exhibits, containers, accessories, and props should be inconspicuously labeled with exhibitor's name and phone number.
- Exhibit Drop-off Monday, September 2 and Tuesday, September 3 between 9am and 7pm
- Exhibit tags with corresponding numbers will be issued on the entry receiving days.
 - This tag must be securely attached to each exhibit and must remain on the exhibit throughout the Fair.
 - When exhibit tags are issued, a stub with a duplicate number will be given to the exhibitor. This stub will serve as his/her claim check to recover and secure the release of his/her exhibit.
 - Claim checks should be guarded carefully, since Department Superintendents and Directors are not allowed to release any exhibit without presentation of the exhibit tag stub. If the claim check is lost, such loss should be reported promptly, and it will be necessary for the exhibitor to furnish the Superintendent of the Entry Department proof of ownership of the article on exhibit.
- Once the exhibit is numbered and tagged, it should be delivered to the appropriate area.
 - The exhibit will be placed/arranged in the appropriate area, for suitable and attractive display.
 - The Fair management reserves the right to reject any exhibit which does not reflect merit, and which would not be a credit to both the exhibitor and the Fair.
 - The North Carolina Mountain State Fair assumes no responsibility for the incorrect tagging of exhibits.
 - Division Directors, Department Superintendents, and/or Judges must report disqualification of entries to the Manager of the Mountain State Fair immediately after such action is taken.
- Exhibit Pick-up Date Monday, September 16 between 9am and 7pm
 - Unclaimed exhibits will be considered abandoned after closing at 7pm and may be disposed of as the Manager of the Fair sees fit.
 - Removal of exhibits before the date and time specified will cause the forfeiture of all awards won, all fees paid, and the right to further participate in the Fair.

 Superintendents or their family members are not eligible to enter exhibits in the department(s) they are overseeing for competition but can be used for Display Only.



Judging and Awards

- Decision of the judges will be final, and no appeal will be considered except in cases of protest in writing, with strong evidence of fraud or violation of the rules of the Fair.
 - Protests must be filed with the Division Superintendent no later than Monday after the fair opens and must be accompanied by a protest fee of \$5 which will be retained by the Fair if the protest is not sustained.
 - The Division Superintendent will appoint a committee to consider the protest, and all interested parties will be notified of the time of the hearing and will be given an opportunity to be heard.
 - The rules of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions governing appeals will be those of the North Carolina Mountain State Fair.
- No premium will be awarded to any exhibit that does not possess high intrinsic merit. All exhibits must be individually worthy. It is not the policy of the Fair to encourage indifferent production of any kind, or to distribute premiums equally among exhibitors.
 - Fraud or deception in any form will be exposed.
 - Any exhibitor found guilty of such violation will be excluded from further participation in the Fair and all premiums previously won will be forfeited.
 - Judges, when requested, may give the reasons for their decisions embracing the value and desirable qualities of the exhibits to which they have awarded premiums.
- Unless otherwise specified in the Department Rules and Regulations, no exhibitor may be paid more than two premiums in any one individual class.
- No exhibitor may accompany judges during their deliberations.
 - A judge cannot judge in a department in which he/she or any member of that judge's family has entered an exhibit.
 - Any exhibitor attempting to interfere with adjudication, or who publicly expresses disapproval of the decision of the judges, will be excluded from further competition and any premiums previously won will be forfeited.
- Premiums will be paid only on the basis of the records of the judging reports, which will be signed by the judge and by the Department Superintendent or Director.
 - Ribbons will be securely attached to the articles upon which they were awarded, if possible, but the ribbons and pins have no value in the payment of premiums.
- Entries made in wrong classes may be reclassed by the Entry Department Staff.
 - \circ $\;$ All records associated with the entry must be changed at that time.
 - If the records are altered and the entry department files are not changed, premiums will be withheld.
 - "Any other" or "Miscellaneous" categories at the end of each catalog section are only for items that are not listed in preceding categories. They shall not be used for duplications.
- There shall not be more than one premium paid for each placement in a class.
- No Exhibitor will be paid more than two premiums in any one individual class.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Please read important information on preceding pages 4, 8, and 9.

- Each garden space will be 10' x 10'. There are a limited number of garden spaces available, and they will be issued based on entries received first.
- The gardens are to be educational as well as artistic and should be functional for the purpose designed. The physical features should serve the purpose intended (e.g., walks should have a destination or disappear with the illusion of a destination).
- Correct common names of plants must be provided. Botanical names should also be included. This information must be easily readable by the general public from outside the garden. No artificial material is allowed.
- Necessary structures and accessories such as walkways, fountains, fences, etc. are permitted as long as they adhere to the theme.
- Exhibitors are expected to clean, replace dead plant material, and water daily. If the garden is not kept attractive, it will be disqualified. Monday through Thursday gardens must be attended to by 2:00 p.m. Tickets will be handed out for Friday, Saturday, and Sunday.
- Exhibitors should place at least two spotlights or equivalent lighting in garden for night lighting. The NC Mountain State Fair will provide electricity to garden site, but no drop cords.
- Absolutely no dyed, artificial, or painted flowers or plants may be used. All plants must be live, in containers or balled and burlapped, and nursery grown. Plants may not be collected from the wild.
- Threatened or endangered species will not be permitted unless legally grown. Display should not include plants of cannabis, hemp, or invasive species.
- All material, including plant accessories, soil and mulch must be removed and the site should be cleaned and raked.

*Superintendents or their family members are not eligible to enter exhibits in the department(s) they are overseeing for competition but can be used for Display Only.

- 5. Quality
- 6. Color
- 7. Make sure your entry is in the right class.
- 8. Be sure to prepare the exhibits according to catalog instructions.
- 9. Please indicate variety on entry tag.



- All products must be processed according to recognized safe methods found in the most recent editions of the Ball Blue Book, the USDA Complete Guide to Home Canning, or recipes from the National Center for Home Food Preservation at the University of Georgia, https://nchfp.uga.edu/. Inverted jams and jellies will not be judged.

• All jars must be labeled as to content, processing method (pressure canner or boiling water bath) and processing time. In order to award premiums on a quality basis, <u>containers may be opened</u>.

- Exhibits will be ruled out when not in standard canning jars of the specified size. Please include the ring with two-piece lids. This does not include flavored vinegars. Do not use decorative fabric under the ring.
- Unless an article is of good quality, no premiums will be awarded.
- Dried fruits, vegetables and herbs are an exception to recipe rule. Must be labeled as to content and method used for drying.

• There will not be more than one ribbon awarded and one award paid for each placement in a class.

CONTEST RULES

- Recipe must include at least 1 ½ cups of fresh sweetpotatoes. Entry needs to serve 4 to 6 judges.
- Entrants cannot be employees of the NCDA&CS or the NC Sweetpotato Commission; their immediate family or household members are not eligible to enter.
- Judging will be based on: Taste (45), Creative Use of Sweetpotatoes (30), Preparation/Cooking Time (20), Presentation (5).
- Directions for preparing the recipe must be clear. Measurements should be in level cups, tablespoons, teaspoons, or fractions thereof; also include pan size, cooking temperature, preparation time, cooking time and number of servings.
- Use ingredients that are readily available in grocery stores.
- This contest is open to all ages and for amateurs only. Culinary professionals may not enter the contest.
- Contestants may enter more than one recipe, but only the top scoring recipe will be eligible for the cash prize per participant.
- Entries must be prepared at home and presented at the Fair ready for judging. Insulated containers are encouraged for transportation to keep foods hot or cold.
- Upon submission, recipes become the property of the North Carolina Sweetpotato Commission and the North Carolina Mountain State Fair, which reserve the right to edit, adapt, copyright, publish and use for publicity, promotion, or advertising without compensation.
- Each night the winners will be announced at 5:15 pm.

DAY OF CONTEST

- Entries must be received from 3:00 to 4:00 pm in the Davis Event Center. NO ENTRIES ACCEPTED AFTER 4:00pm.
- Judging will begin at 4:00 pm
- Prizes will be awarded at 5:15 pm.
- Contestants will ONLY be admitted to the Fair free of charge WITH ENTRY through the Gate 5 entrance. Park in lot at Gate 5.
- Entries may be brought in any type of container (preferably disposable), but it will not be the responsibility of the Fair to return any dishes or containers.
- The entry must be prepared at home and brought to the fair on the day and time of the contest.
- . NO recipes printed from the internet will be accepted.
- Each original recipe must be typed or legibly written on Recipe Format sheet and presented with the dish. Information must contain the contestant's telephone number, address, county and email address (if available).

DIVISION II - LIVESTOCK RULES & REGULATIONS

RELEASE OF EXHIBITS

Premiums will be forfeited if animals are removed from stall or pen space prior to release date and time. (See respective Departments.)

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Except in the case of conflict, in which event the following Rules and Regulations will prevail, the General Rules and Regulations of the Fair will govern this Division. **Illegal drugs, and/or unethical conduct in fitting and showing livestock will not be tolerated.** All others will be at judge's discretion.

Any animals being removed before their release time will forfeit all premiums.

Exhibitors bringing animals that have been micro-chipped must bring a reader, as well as their papers.

All Livestock Shows conducted according to IAFE Code of Show Ring Ethics can be found on fair web site: <u>www.wncagcenter.org</u>

Exhibitors must wear proper attire while in the show ring: long pants, shirt with collar, shoes with closed toe.

No animals will be allowed on the fairgrounds until their check-in time.

Maximum Youth age, 19, is as of show date unless specified by Department.

Allow up to 10 weeks for premiums to be processed.

ENTRIES

MAKE YOUR ENTRIES EARLY!! The right is reserved and will be used to reject entries received after all available space is taken, even if this occurs before specified time for closing entries.

Online Entries Only!! Be sure to fill in the online form completely and accurately. Give your rural route number, post office box number, or city street address, zip code, <u>Social Security Number on the W-9 form</u>, and telephone number, including area code. Note that exhibitors who choose not to disclose their full Social Security Number or Federal ID on the W-9 form at the time of registration, <u>even if they have submitted an entry in the past</u>, forfeit any and all premiums.

NO PREMIUMS WILL BE RELEASED WITHOUT SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER OR TAX ID NUMBER. IF THE NUMBER LISTED ON THE ENTRY FORM DOES NOT MATCH THE NAME ON THE ENTRY FORM WHEN GIVEN TO THE IRS, YOU COULD BE SUBJECT TO IRS FINES.

List the class number, as indicated in the premium list, for which each entry is made. Use a separate line for each animal. Do not make entries in the Championship classes. Indicate if you plan to make entries in the group and/or herd classes. It is not necessary to name the animals that will make up your group or herd until after judging of individual classes. Entries in the group and herd classes must have previously been exhibited in the individual classes.

Bring your registration certificates to the Fair; they must be shown if requested by the superintendent. All beef cattle and swine over six months of age and all sheep over three months of age must be registered with their respective breed associations in the name of the bona fide owner, who must show official evidence of ownership of animal at least 30 days prior to showing. Animals shown as commercial are exempt from registration requirements. (See exceptions to this rule for group classes only in some departments.)

Each breed of livestock must be exhibited by more than one farm if the breed is to be considered for continuance in the 2021 N C Mountain State Fair Premium List.

SHOWMANSHIP AWARD

A showmanship award will be given to youth that are officially entered in a WNC Youth Livestock Expo and have developed proper showmanship skills with their livestock projects. These skills will be evaluated separately from the quality of the animal shown. The show person iudge will select the youth solely on their showmanship ability.

*Premiums will be paid only as noted in the judges' books. *

Entry fees are required for all entries in the senior and open classes of the livestock division. *Entries exclusively in the youth livestock shows are not subject to fees.*

All applicants for entries must be noted on the entry form, and remittances for same must accompany the entry application form. Reservations will not be made unless accompanied by the required fee. Remember: The right is reserved to reject entries after all available space is taken. Entries will be accepted in the order received.

Animals duly entered in the show which will be exhibited competitively in the show ring will have priority on stall and pen space; thereafter, should additional space be available, display animals will be assigned stall or pen space.

The following fees will govern:

RV (Electricity and/or utilities)\$ 35/ per night(RV units staying the full 10 days will be given priority over RV units staying less than 10 days.)

ANIMAL HEALTH REGULATIONS

All Animals:

The animal health regulations of the Veterinary Division of the North Carolina Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services will be strictly enforced, and decisions of the regulatory veterinarian concerning animal health status are final. No animals may be unloaded on the fairgrounds before being inspected and approved by the regulatory veterinarian during their designated check-in times.

All animals not meeting the entry requirements, that have an unthrifty nature or are in an unsuitable condition, and/or are exhibiting any signs of disease or illness (including obvious abscesses that are opened or closed, ringworm, sore mouth or any other signs of contagious disease) may be refused entry and will not be allowed in the barn, may be isolated and/or required to be returned to the farm of origin as determined by the regulatory veterinarian. Any questionable health problems will be referred to the regulatory veterinarian, show committee, and/or the State Veterinarian.

During the duration of the Fair, all animals of unthrifty nature, unsuitable condition and/or exhibiting any signs of disease or illness or found not to have met entry requirements after entry may be required to be isolated and/or returned to the farm of origin as determined by the regulatory veterinarian.

The Fair staff works diligently to prevent diseased animals from entering the fairgrounds, though owners should consider that animals may be exposed to infectious agents while at the Fair. It is a best management practice to keep exhibit animals returning from the Fair separate from your animals at home for 2-3 weeks. By isolating exhibited animals for this time, any animals exposed to disease while at the Fair should show signs of infection during this period. Once this period has passed, they can then be commingled with the animals that remained home.

Exhibitors are discouraged from bringing their dogs with them to the fair. If dogs must be brought, they are to remain in areas that are inaccessible to the public and must not be available for contact with the general public. Proof of rabies vaccination needs to be on hand.

Premises Registration is voluntary to exhibit livestock (beef and dairy cattle, horse, breeding swine, sheep, goats, and rabbits) and poultry at the WNC Livestock Expo. Choosing to register your premises puts you on the frontline of controlling and preventing the spread of animal disease. A disease outbreak can't be predicted but it can impact every segment of animal agriculture. Participation ensures that you have the information you need, when you need it most, to protect your animals and your investment. Registering a premise involves obtaining an alpha-numeric "identifier" for the farm, ranch, veterinary clinic or other site where livestock or fowl are handled, housed, managed or processed. If an exhibitor wants more information or wishes to register for a National or State Premises ID, the exhibitor can:

Livestock:

ALL LIVESTOCK ARE REQUIRED TO HAVE AN ENTRANCE HEALTH EXAMINATION AT TIME OF CHECK-IN AS A PREREQUISITE FOR ENTRY ONTO THE FAIRGROUNDS AND WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO ENTER THE BARNS UNTIL INSPECTED AND PASSED BY HEALTH OFFICIALS.

All livestock must have a form of identification (ear tag, tattoo, ear notch, or microchip - readers must be supplied by owner) to enter the fairgrounds.

All sheep and goats must comply with USDA and NCDA&CS Scrapie Eradication Program guidelines. Sheep and goats without a scrapie tag, or a registration paper with corresponding tattoo or microchip information at the time of check-in will not be allowed. Scrapie Flock ID numbers must be presented at the time of check-in before an approval card can be issued. The Scrapie Flock ID number is not the same as the National or State Premises ID number. To obtain a scrapie Flock ID number, please see the Goat and Sheep entry requirements section.

Livestock and Poultry:

Drug and Chemical Compounds Policy for All NCDA&CS Sponsored Fairs, Exhibitions, and Events

The use of any drug and/or chemical compound in any manner that is not approved by the FDA, including but not limited to indications and directions on species, age, dosage amounts and/or withdrawal times, is illegal and prohibited.

The owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer and/or responsible person must notify the show management prior to admittance into the livestock barns of any animal that is being administered drugs or chemical compounds in accordance with approved FDA guidelines for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal. Acceptance of the animal for exhibition will be at the discretion of the livestock superintendent and the show veterinarian and will depend on such factors as the nature of the drug or chemical compound and justification by an accredited veterinarian with a valid client-patient relationship. Regardless, livestock will not be allowed to exhibit if use of any drugs or chemical compounds will affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event.

Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and/or responsible persons will be held accountable for the presence of any violative drug residue from their animal and subject to the disposition as specified below:

- 1. Findings of proof in intentional use of any drug or chemical compound in a manner described as illegal and prohibited by the Policy on Use of Drugs and Chemical Compounds will result in immediate disqualification, forfeiture of all premiums and prizes, market value of the animal (in the case of market animals), and a life-time ban on exhibiting in NCDA&CS sponsored events.
- 2. If proof of intentional use of any drug or chemical compound in an illegal and prohibited manner cannot be found on an animal that has been demonstrated by the above detailed laboratory methods to have the presence of such a substance, a first time offense for a positive test will result in immediate disqualification, forfeiture of all premiums and prizes, market value of the animal (in the case of market animals), and a one-year prohibition on exhibiting in NCDA&CS sponsored events by the exhibitor of the positive animal. A second time offense by that exhibitor for any drug or chemical compound in a manner described as illegal and prohibited will result in immediate disqualification, forfeiture of all premiums and prizes, market value of the animal (in the case of market animals), and a life-time ban on exhibiting in NCDA&CS sponsored events by the exhibitor of the positive animal (in the case of market animals), and a life-time ban on exhibiting in NCDA&CS sponsored events by the exhibitor of the positive animal (in the case of market animals), and a life-time ban on exhibiting in NCDA&CS sponsored events by the exhibitor of the positive animal.

Drug testing at the Fair may include, and is not limited to, the following drugs:

Acepromazine, Albuterol, Altrogest, Azaperone, Balbuterol, Boldenone, Bumetanide, Chlorpromazine and all other tranquilizers, Clenbuterol, Dexamethasone, Flumethasone, Flunixin, Furosemide, Isoetharine, Isoflupredone, Flumethasone, Methylprednisolone, Nandrolone, Paylean (labeled for swine only), Phenylbutazone, Optiflex (labled for feedlot cattle only), and Terbutaline. Paylean and Optiflex are <u>illegal for use in sheep and goats</u>.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS BY SPECIES

Any of the species listed below entering the fairgrounds regardless of their purpose of entry must meet the requirements listed for that species.

CATTLE - BEEF and DAIRY

Animals with obvious abscesses (open or unopened), ringworm, sore mouth, or any other signs of contagious disease WILL NOT BE ALLOWED IN THE BARN.

Cattle from out-of-state exhibitors must be accompanied by an official health certificate issued within 30 days of entry signed by an accredited veterinarian, or an approved state or federally employed veterinarian. The health certificate should contain the following:

- 1. Name and address of exhibitor.
- 2. Description of each animal including breed, age, sex, and registration, tattoo, or ear tag numbers.
- 3. A statement by the veterinarian signing the health certificate that the cattle listed are not infected with, nor have been recently exposed to, any communicable disease to the best of his/her knowledge.
- 4. Information relating to Brucellosis.
 - a. Those cattle which are native to North Carolina need not be tested. (Native meaning those cattle which were born in North Carolina or which have met North Carolina import requirements.)
 - b. Cattle originating from any certified Brucellosis free herd, regardless of the state of origin, may enter North Carolina, provided the following information is recorded on the official certificate:
 - i. The individual identification of each animal;
 - ii. The herd certification number;
 - iii. The date of the last herd test; and
 - iv. A permit when otherwise required in the rule.
 - c. Cattle imported from a Class Free State shall originate from a herd not under quarantine and need not be tested.
 - d. Cattle imported from a Class A State shall originate from a herd not under quarantine and pass a negative official blood test within 60 days prior to entry into North Carolina.
 - e. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this Rule, a Brucellosis test is not required for steers or spayed females, and no test prior to entry in the state is required of:
 - i. Cattle under eight (8) months of age;
 - ii. Dairy heifers under 20 months of age officially vaccinated against Brucellosis
 - iii. Heifers of the beef breed less than 24 months of age officially vaccinated against Brucellosis;
- 5. Information relating to tuberculosis: A test for tuberculosis is not required for cattle which are native to North Carolina. Any cattle over 6 months of age not originating from a Tuberculosis Free state shall be required to have an official tuberculosis test within 60 days of entry, unless from an accredited herd.

SWINE

Animals with obvious abscesses (open or unopened), ringworm, sore mouth, or any signs of other contagious disease WILL NOT BE ALLOWED IN THE BARN.

Swine from out-of-state exhibitors (including market hogs) must be accompanied by an official health certificate issued within 30 days of entry signed by an accredited veterinarian, or an approved state or federally employed veterinarian. The health certificate should contain the following:

- 1. Name and address of exhibitor.
- 2. Description of each animal including age, sex, breed, and any registrations, ear tag, or ear notch numbers.
- 3. Statement by the veterinarian attesting that the swine listed are not infected with, or have been recently exposed to, any communicable disease to the best of his/her knowledge.
- 4. Statement by the veterinarian that all breeding swine in the consignment originate from a Pseudorabies virus (PRV) Stage IV or V state or a Validated Brucellosis-Free and Qualified Pseudorabies-Free Herd. The herd validation qualification numbers must be listed. This requirement does not apply to market hogs.

GOATS and SHEEP

Animals with obvious abscesses (open or unopened), ringworm, sore mouth, or any signs of other contagious disease WILL NOT BE ALLOWED IN THE BARN.

Sheep must have been recently shorn prior to arrival to accommodate veterinary inspections. Fleece length shall not exceed 1/4 inch at arrival (exemption provided for breeding sheep shown in fleece or with fitted fleece). Animals which are not shorn will not be allowed to stall or enter the check-in line.

Goats and sheep from out-of-state exhibitors must be accompanied by an official health certificate issued within 30 days of entry signed by an accredited veterinarian or an approved state or federally employed veterinarian. The health certificate should contain the following:

- 1. Name and address of exhibitor.
- 2. Description of each animal including breed, age, sex, and any registration, tattoo, microchip or ear tag numbers.
- 3. A statement by the veterinarian signing the health certificate that the goats listed are not infected with, or have been recently exposed to, any communicable disease to the best of his/her knowledge. The health certificate shall contain a statement that the flock of origin has not had Scrapie diagnosed within the past 42 months. All goats must comply with USDA Scrapie Eradication Program guidelines. All goats must be appropriately identified and comply with USDA and NCDA&CS Scrapie Eradication Program guidelines. If you have any questions about the program or would like to request a flock identification number and tags, North Carolina residents may call (919) 707-3250 or complete and submit the North Carolina Scrapie Ear tag Order Form located behind the livestock entry form, and out-of-state participants may call 1-866-USDA Tag (873-2824).
- 4. Any animal showing evidence of suspicious fungal lesions must have a signed veterinarian's statement on the health certificate with the date and type of treatment.
- 5. Dairy sheep and goats over six (6) months of age and sexually intact imported from out of state must have a negative brucellosis test within 30 days prior to import. All imports over six (6) months of age must have a negative tuberculosis test within 60 days prior to import unless they originate from a certified and accredited herd or are consigned for immediate slaughter.
 - a. The brucellosis and tuberculosis testing requirements shall not apply to goats entering the state only for exhibition purposes from states that are USDA Tuberculosis Accredited-Free and Brucellosis Certified free, when accompanied by an official health certificate. Such animals shall remain in the state for exhibition purposes for no more than 30 days from the date of issuance of the health certificate.

HORSES, MULES, PONIES, and OTHER EQUINE

Animals with obvious abscesses (opened or unopened) or any other signs of contagious disease **WILL NOT BE ALLOWED IN THE BARN.**

NCDA&CS requires that all equine six (6) months old and older must be in possession of a current negative Equine Infections Anemia (EIA) test (Coggins Certificate). The negative EIA test must be current and issued within twelve (12) months. A copy of a current (12 months) negative Coggins test certificate must be presented at check-in and unloading.

Equine from out-of-state exhibitors must also be accompanied by an official health certificate issued within 30 days of entry signed by an accredited veterinarian or an approved state or federally employed veterinarian or a valid equine event permit (also known as an equine passport or extended equine certificate of veterinary inspection). The health certificate should contain the following:

- 1. Name and address of exhibitor.
- 2. Description of each animal including breed, age, sex, and registration, tattoo, or microchip number as applicable.
- 3. A statement by the veterinarian signing the health certificate that the equine listed are not infected with, nor have been recently exposed to, any communicable disease to the best of his/her knowledge. Veterinarians should contact the department at (919) 707-3250 during outbreaks of vesicular stomatitis in the U.S. for additional statement requirements.

ALPACAS, GUANACOS, LLAMAS, AND VICUNAS

Animals with obvious abscesses (open or unopened), ringworm, sore mouth, or any other signs of contagious disease WILL NOT BE ALLOWED IN THE BARN.

Alpacas, guanacos, llamas, and vicunas from out-of-state exhibitors must be accompanied by an official health certificate issued within 30 days of entry signed by an accredited veterinarian or an approved state or federally employed veterinarian. Alpacas, guanacos, llamas and vicunas are exempt from tuberculosis and brucellosis testing. The health certificate should contain the following:

- 1. Name and address of exhibitor.
- 2. Description of each animal including breed, age, sex, and registration, tattoo, or microchip number as applicable.
- 3. A statement by the veterinarian signing the health certificate that the alpacas, guanacos, llamas, or vicunas listed are not infected with, nor have been recently exposed to, any communicable disease to the best of his/her knowledge.

RABBITS

Animals with signs of contagious disease **WILL NOT BE ALLOWED IN THE BARN.** All feed and hay from states experiencing cases of rabbit hemorrhagic disease virus (RHDV) are **BANNED** from entering the fairgrounds (see

<u>https://www.aphis.usda.gov/aphis/maps/animal-health/rhd</u> for a current map of outbreaks in the United States). Any rabbit that has participated in other shows or exhibitions **MUST BE** quarantined and isolated for at least 14 days prior to being allowed entry to the fairgrounds.

Rabbits from out-of-state exhibitors must be accompanied by an official health certificate issued within 30 days of entry signed by an accredited veterinarian or an approved state or federally employed veterinarian. The health certificate should contain the following:

- 1. Name and address of exhibitor.
- 2. Description of each animal including breed, age, sex, and registration, tattoo, or microchip number as applicable.
- 3. A statement by the veterinarian signing the health certificate that the rabbits listed are not infected with, nor have been recently exposed to, any communicable disease to the best of his/her knowledge.

EXOTIC MAMMALS

Exotic mammals with obvious abscesses (open or unopened), ringworm, sore mouth, or any other signs of contagious disease WILL NOT BE ALLOWED IN THE BARN.

Exotic mammals as defined by NCDA&CS from out-of-state exhibitors must be accompanied by an official health certificate issued within 30 days of entry signed by an accredited veterinarian or approved state or federally employed veterinarian. The health certificate should contain the following:

- 1. Name and address of exhibitor.
- 2. Description of each animal including breed, age, sex, and registration, animal identification tag, tattoo, or microchip number as applicable.
- 3. A statement by the veterinarian signing the health certificate that the exotic mammals listed are not infected with, nor have been recently exposed to, any communicable disease to the best of his/her knowledge.

Exotic mammals include and are not limited to bison, buffalo and all other bovidae (other than domestic cattle), Old World camelids, etc. For applicable species, animals from out-of-state must have negative test results for brucellosis within 30 days and tuberculosis within 60 days for all animals six months old and older and must have the certification statement, "The herd of origin has had no brucellosis or tuberculosis diagnosed within the past 12 months" included on the certificate.

POULTRY AND OTHER AVIAN SPECIES

Birds will not be accepted which are infected with or showing any clinical signs of an infectious or communicable disease or are infested with lice and/or mites.

All chickens, turkeys and guineas must be identified with numbered tamper-proof bands. Bands placed on birds tested by state testers will satisfy this requirement. Poultry entered at the fair are subject to examination (including blood test and swabs by a representative of the NCDA&CS).

No poultry shall have received a live virus vaccine within 30 days prior to entering the fair.

All avian species from out-of-state exhibitors must be accompanied by either:

- i. a current VS 9-3 NPIP form that states the birds are from a flock certified as NPIP US H5/H7 Avian Influenza (AI) clean from the state of origin or
- an official health certificate issued within 30 days of entry signed by an accredited veterinarian or approved state or federally employed veterinarian (5 days if they are pigeons, doves, birds of prey, psittacines, or song birds; contact NCDA&CS Veterinary Division/Poultry if there are questions regarding issuing time to entry). If an official health certificate is used, the health certificate should contain the following:
 - 1. Name and address of exhibitor.
 - 2. Description of each bird including breed, age, sex, other animal identification, etc.
 - 3. A statement by the veterinarian signing the health certificate that the birds listed are not infected with, nor have been recently exposed to, any communicable disease to the best of his/her knowledge.
 - 4. Poultry and ratites must
 - a. originates from Pullorum-Typhoid clean flocks or have tested negative for Pullorum-Typhoid within 30 days of entry
 - b. originates from an NPIP H5/H7 AI Clean or US AI Clean flock or have tested negative for Avian Influenza within 21days of entry

All in state chickens and turkeys for exhibition must originate from NPIP certified U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid Clean flocks or have a negative pullorum-typhoid test within 90 days of entry. The test requirements may be satisfied by a negative test conducted by an official state tester at the time the birds are brought to the fair. In state birds may be randomly selected for Avian Influenza testing at the time the birds are brought to the fair.

Out-of-State birds will not be admitted for North Carolina poultry competitions.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE JUNIOR BEEF SHOWS AND SALE

- The Junior Beef Shows and Sale are sponsored by the Western North Carolina Beef Commission and the WNC Youth Livestock Expo. The Western North Carolina Beef Commission will sponsor ribbons and trophies, unless so stated in this book. Additional premiums and classes may be offered by the Western North Carolina Beef Commission in addition to what is presented by the NC Mountain State Fair.
- 2. Any youth in the counties of western North Carolina, west of and including Avery, Butke, Rutherford, Polk, McDowell, Cleveland, Caldwell, Watauga Counties, are eligible to exhibit or approved by Superintendent.
- 3. The Health Regulations of the Veterinary Division of the N.C. Department of Agriculture will be strictly enforced. Be sure to read these under "Rules & Regulations of the Livestock Division" before entering. Animals cannot be unloaded until checked in.
- 4. All animals must be shown at halter.
- 5. If an exhibitor has more than one animal in a class, the second entry may be shown by an exhibitor approved by the show superintendent.
- 6. Each exhibitor or buyer must assume all liability in the case of death or injury to his/her livestock.
- 7. In any case where questions arise that are not covered specifically by these or the following rules, the decision of the WNC Jr. Beef Show Rules Committee will be final.
- 8. In the Feeder Steer, Market Steer, and Heifer Shows, first place will return to compete for Grand Champion with the secondplace class winners standing by for Reserve Champion competition. In the event the first-place class winner is not eligible for, or withdraws from, the Championship class, the second and third place winners will participate as stated.
- 9. NC Mountain State Fair will pay class premiums placing 1st 5th for WNC District Junior Feeder Steer, WNC District Junior Market Steer, WNC District Junior Beef Heifer Show.

- 1. Each exhibitor is limited to two (2) entries.

DAIRY GOAT SHOWS

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE DAIRY GOAT SHOW

- 1. Competition is open to the world for animals registered or recorded in the American Dairy Goat Association, American Goat Society, or the Canadian Goat Society. Both shows are sanctioned separately by the American Dairy Goat Association for the following breeds: Alpines, LaManchas, Nubians, Oberhaslis, Saanens, Nigerian Dwarf, Toggenbutgs and Recorded Grades. All rules that are governed by ADGA shall be followed and enforced.
- 2. Ages of the animals in the show will be computed from September 7, 2024.
- 3. All entries must comply with both ADGA and Mountain State Fair rules. Be thoroughly familiar with both.
- 4. Be sure to use the official entry form and include the goat's tattoo and registration number. List the class number in which the animal will be shown and indicate any group classes an animal is to enter. In order to be shown in a group class, the doe must have competed in her individual class and the dairy herd class must be pre-entered with a herd name.
- 5. Up to TWO (2) substitutions of animals will be allowed per exhibitor.
- 6. A registration paper or a stamped duplicate (for animals under six months of age) is required for each animal. Proof of ownership shall be the name on the registration or recordation certificate. No signed transfers will be accepted. Youth name must be listed on the ADGA Signature Card and presented at time of show.
- 7. Each exhibitor will be limited to one premium payment in each of the group classes.
- 8. The Health Regulations of the Veterinary Division of the N.C. Department of Agriculture will be strictly enforced. Be sure to read these under "Rules and Regulations of the Livestock Division" before entering. Animals cannot be unloaded until checked in. All sheep and goats must comply with USDA Scrapie Eradication Program Guidelines. (State request form can be found behind Livestock Entry Form.)
- 9. Entry in the Champion Challenge class is open to permanent champions only. Qualification must be by registration/ recordation or written certification by the American Dairy Goat Association. Champion Challenge competitors shall NOT be foreclosed from group and progeny classes. Shifts from regular classes to Champion Challenge may be made (with proof of qualification) any time before the beginning of judging of breed.
- 10. A separate entry form must be used for Junior Doe Show and Senior Doe Show (Junior Show is defined as age of the goat, not the exhibitor).
- 11. If entering more than one breed, please group all animals together by breeds.
- 12. Show order will be as follows: Nigerian Dwarf, Oberhasli, Recorded Grade, Saanens, Toggenbutgs, Alpine, LaManchas, and Nubians. (Show order is not subject to change.)
- 13. Animals must be legibly tattooed prior to show date. Animals which have been re-tattooed must have the changes indicated on the ADGA registration paper.
- 14. ADGA dress code is required. Exhibitors are to wear white or off-white, if possible, while exhibiting goats. (NO SHORTS)
- 15. There will be no dogs permitted on show premises.
- 16. There will be no pre-show milk out.
- 17. Showmanship class age will be as of show date.

- 18. Youth Dairy Goat Show is open to all exhibitors **under 21 years of age** prior to the day of the show. This is a combination Junior Doe and Senior Doe show.
- 19. All animals must arrive no later than 7:00 p.m. Friday, September 6.
- 20. The NC Mountain State Fair or its representatives reserve the right to limit the number of animals when all available space has been filled.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. Birds will be entered in single classes only.
- 2. Birds will be judged in class listed on entry form. No class changes during check-in.
- 3. Premiums will be paid by check after the fair.
- 4. All birds will be cared for and fed by the fair.
- 5. The fair will furnish cages and cups for food and water.
- 6. The fair management reserves the right to interpret, amend, or add to these rules.
- 7. All birds must be entered in the name of the bona fide owner, who must have owned the birds for at least 60 days prior to deadline.
- 8. All birds are entered at the risk of the owner, and the NC Mountain State Fair management will not be responsible for any loss or damage but will exercise all possible vigilance in the care of the birds. No one will be allowed to handle birds on display except the owners and officials of the show.
- 9. The American Standard of Perfection will be the guide of the judges in awarding premiums. The premiums will be paid on standard varieties listed in this show catalog, and then only to worthy specimens.
- 10. Decision of the judges will be final, and no appeal will be considered except in the cases of protest in writing, with strong evidence of fraud or violation of the rules of the fair. Protest must be filed with the division superintendent no later than noon of the day following the award and must be accompanied by a protest fee of \$5.00 which will be retained by the fair if the protest is not sustained. The division superintendent will appoint a committee to consider the protest, and all interested parties will be notified of the time of the hearing and will be given an opportunity to be heard. The NC Mountain State Fair will follow the rules of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions governing appeals.
- 11. Judges will not award premiums to any animal because of its mere presence. It must be individually worthy. It is not the policy of the fair to encourage indifferent production of any kind, or to distribute premiums equally among exhibitors. No premium will be awarded to any exhibit that does not possess high intrinsic merit.
- 12. Unless otherwise specified in the department rules and regulations, no exhibitor may win more than two premiums in any one individual class, and not more than one premium in any group class.
- 13. No exhibitor may accompany judges during their deliberations except such attendants as are necessary to handle and show livestock and other such exhibits. Any exhibitor attempting to interfere with adjudication, or who publicly expresses disapproval of the decision of the judges, will be excluded from further competition and any premiums previously won will be forfeited.
- 14. The judge will have the right not to award a first-place ribbon/premium if the item does not merit the placing. Awards in any class will be given only if merited.
- 15. Fraud or deception as to breeding, or in any other form, will be exposed and exhibitor guilty of such violation will be excluded from further participation in the fair and all premiums previously won will be forfeited.
- 16. The right is reserved and will be used to reject entries received after all available space is taken, even if this occurs before specified time for closing entries.
- 17. Old English breeds that are not dubbed can be shown but will not be judged except for young birds.
- 18. Production breeds can be shown but will not be judged.
- 19. Premiums will be paid only based on the records of the judging report, which will be signed by the judge and by the department superintendent or director. Ribbons will be securely attached to the cages upon which they were awarded, if possible, but the ribbons have no value in payment of premiums since they may become detached and find their way on to the wrong exhibit.
- 21. Any other or miscellaneous categories at the end of each area are only for items which are not listed in preceding categories. They shall not be used for duplications.
- 22. Judges, when requested, may give the reasons for their decisions embracing the value and desirable qualities of the exhibits to which they have awarded premiums.
- 23. Judges will not award premiums or ribbons to any animal that does not qualify for one of the classes in the NC Mountain State Fair premium list. There will be no additional prize money for given places, in the event of a tie. There shall not be more than one ribbon awarded and premium paid for each placement in a class.
- 24. Premiums will be paid to winning exhibitors after the award reports are compiled and checked. Premiums will be mailed to the exhibitor at the address on his or her entry form. This process takes approximately ten weeks. Errors in premium statements will be corrected until **December 1, 2024**, after which time the books of the fair are closed.

JUDGING

- 1. Judges will use the latest American Standard of Perfection. Judges may withhold prizes if birds are not of sufficient merit.
- 2. Any person who interferes with judges will forfeit all premiums. The decision of the judges will be final.
- 3. After the judging, exhibitors can place any advertising material, by the exhibitor, with his coop.

HEALTH REGULATIONS

- 1. All bird entries will be presented for examination (including blood test and swabs) to a representative of the NCDA & CS Veterinary Division before being placed in the show.
- All chicken entries will originate from U.S. pullorum-typhoid clean or equivalent flocks or have a negative pullorum-typhoid test within 90 days of admission to the fair. The test requirements may be satisfied by a negative test conducted by a representative of the NCDA & CS Veterinarian Division at the time birds are brought to the fair.
- 3. All birds must be identified with numbered tamper-proof bands. Bands placed on birds tested at the fairgrounds by a representative of the NCDA & CS Veterinarian Division will satisfy the requirement. The Health Regulations of the Veterinary Division of the N.C. Department of Agriculture will be strictly enforced. Be sure to read these under "Rules & Regulations of the Livestock Division" before entering. Animals cannot be unloaded until checked in.
- 4. No poultry shall have received a live virus vaccine within 45 days prior to entering the fair. It is recommended that all birds be vaccinated for laryngotracheitis with a modified live virus vaccine at least 45 days and not more than one year before the show.
- 5. Birds will not be accepted which are showing any clinical signs of an infectious or communicable disease or are infected with lice and/or mites.
- 6. All poultry exhibited at the North Carolina Mountain State Fair shall have been in the possession of the exhibitor for 60 days prior to the deadline. Exhibitors will fill out the entry form completely.
- 7. Coops used in transporting live birds to the fair shall not be allowed inside the exhibit tent.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. Competition is open to all North Carolina youth residents under the age of 19 as of August 31, 2024.
- 2. Entries are limited to the first <u>40</u> exhibitors registered online. Can we change to first 40 entries?
- 3. Each exhibitor is required to show a Pen of 3, other birds received during pick-up are to remain at the exhibitor's farm/place for their personal use. If the exhibitor doesn't show any birds, the fair must be notified as to why the no-show. This could affect the exhibitor from being able to show in future shows. Only the chickens shown in the Youth Laying Hen Show will be available for premiums.
- 4. Exhibitor must have raised the chickens from chicks and from the same hatch as all other exhibitors. Fair will set up arrangements with a supplier to ensure same hatch is provided to registered exhibitors.
- 5. Any use of antibiotic and/or growth hormone drugs are strictly prohibited. Any evidence of the use of these drugs will lead to the disqualification of the exhibitor and the exhibitor may be banned from competing in future shows. The show superintendent, judge, NCDA&CS veterinary staff, or fairgrounds administrative staff reserve the right to test the birds being shown for banned substances.
- 6. Exhibitors will be allowed to take chickens home at the conclusion of the show.
- 7. General Rules and Regulations, Judging, and Health Regulations for poultry show will apply. (<u>www.wncagcenter.org</u>)

SHOW DAY AND JUDGING

- 1. All individuals (whether an FFA/4-H club member or individual) will participate in the individual competition.
- 2. Class breaks will be determined by exhibitor age according to the overall participation response. Fair will try to limit these classes to 10 exhibitors per class.
- 3. On judging day all exhibitors must check-in with their top 3 laying hens. Once checked in each exhibitor will be assigned a cage for their pen of 3 to be placed in. It's the exhibitor's responsibility to maintain the cleanliness of the cages until judging time.
- 4. Judging of birds will be based on uniformity, body conformation, health characteristics, and other aspects of the bird quality at the judge's discretion. During judging <u>NO</u> exhibitor is allowed to talk to the judge except when being asked by the judge. Exhibitors may watch but must save all questions until all judging is done. After the competition, exhibitors may ask the judge for clarification on decisions and areas of future improvements. Arguing the decision of the competition with the judge is not allowed and may lead to disqualification of the exhibitor from the competition. Interfering with judging will be grounds for disqualification. These rules may apply to anyone acting on behalf of the exhibitor.

4-H AND FFA CLUBS

- FFA and 4-H groups are encouraged to participate. Each group member will need to register using their individual name 1. and list the club/school's name. A minimum of 5 club members must participate in order to be eligible for club awards.
- 2. Clubs not knowing their members name at the February deadline must register their club and pay for the number of members participating. At the time of April pick-up, a club information sheet listing the names of the participating members along with the corresponding W-9 form must be submitted. There will be NO substitutions after the registration has been completed. The student name must be on the registration and the student named must be present to have the birds judged for the competition.
- An exhibitor may not have more than one group of birds in the competition (i.e... cannot have a set of birds as an individual 3. and another set of birds as a FFA/4-H member). All individuals (whether an FFA/4-H club member or individual) will participant in the individual competition. FFA/4-H club group awards will be based on individual scores. If an individual is participating as a FFA/4-H club group member, the organization must be listed at the time of registration. A current W-9 must be submitted to reflect the organizations Tax I.D. number.

Health Regulations:

- The Health Regulations of the Veterinary Division of the N.C. Department of Agriculture will be strictly enforced. Be sure to read these under "Rules & Regulations of the Livestock Division" before entering. Animals cannot be unloaded until checked in. The decisions of the regulatory veterinarian concerning animal health status are final. - Negative Coggins is required for all Equine.

During the Fair Requirements:

- NO vehicles and trailers allowed on fairgrounds until fair is closed and crowd is cleared out.
- Exhibit must always be manned at ALL times when fair gates are open.
- If your exhibits are not maned while gates are open to the public you could forfeit your premiums and chances of being allowed to exhibit in future fairs.
- Exhibitors removing animals from display before 8:00 p.m. on September 15 will forfeit all awards.

General Information

- At the World Championships, a dancer may only dance twice per contemporary dance category. NO limit for Traditional categories. At regional competitions, there is no limit to the number of times a dancer may dance.
- The caller of the figures must dance on stage with the team.
- A team must place 1st or 2nd with each category and age division at two sanctioned competitions to qualify for the World Championships in October.
- Five certified judges (Determined by UCA) are required. Highest and lowest scores will be dropped, and the 3 middle scores averaged.
- The same 5 judges must judge a competition category in its entirety. Different judges may be used for different categories. Different judges shall NOT be used for different age divisions for the same category.
- A Rules, "Rep", Official will be in attendance and will have the final say regarding any infractions.
- Point Deductions on Rep Sheets for affected categories:
 - 5-point deduction will result if improper number of dancers is used.
 - 2-point deduction for everyone not always dancing in Acapella Team.
 - \circ 1-point deduction for every 15 seconds or portion thereof, exceeding the given time limits.
 - 1-point deduction for each dancer not dressed correctly (Male position dancer must wear slacks; Female position dancers must wear skirt or dress).
 - 1-point deduction for placing dancers on stage. EXCEPTION: Tiny Tot age division.
 - 1-point deduction for "directing" off stage. EXCEPTION: Tiny Tot age division.
 - 1-point deduction for not holding HOME position in Southern Appalachian, Smooth, 4 Couple Precision, 6/8 Couple Precision, and 6/8 Couple Freestyle.
 - 1-point deduction for not swinging to set HOME POSITION in Country Hoedown and 4 couple Precision.
 - 1-point deduction for couples not becoming active to perform small circle figures.
 - 1-point deduction for each required figure not performed and each corner/partner swing not performed when required.
 - 1-point deduction for improper progression.
 - 10-point deduction for dancing more than twice in a Contemporary dance category at the World Championships.
- DRESS CODE: NO Fannies, NO Midriffs, NO Cleavage, Tasteful Clothing in All Categories.

• DISQUALIFICATION:

- Use of alcoholic beverages on premises.
- If Entry Fees are not paid for all dancers performing on stage. (Festival Directors Discretion)
- If a team dances in the wrong age division. Example: You register in adult age division and dance, when the average age of your dancers is Young Adult.
