RULES AND REGULATIONS –

Please read important information on preceding pages 4, 8, and 9.

- Any public, private, charter etc. school in Western North Carolina is invited to participate.
(Including Polk, Rutherford, McDowell, Avery and those further west)
- Entries are to be entered under the school's name, using the school's EIN for tax purposes.
- Each school can enter one entry per class.
- Display items should be inconspicuously labeled with exhibitor's name and phone number.
- A Career-Technical Education booth should represent the school as well as the program areas available at the school such as agriculture, business, family and consumer science, health occupations, marketing, technology, trade and industrial education.
 - Booths have to be self-contained and maintained. (No live plants, No eggs, - raw or cooked)
 - Career pathways and preparation for employment and/or post-secondary education should be emphasized.
- Booth sizes are 8' wide by 8' deep and should **not** exceed the allotted space.
 - **The booths must be self-supporting.**
 - **The back curtain is 8' tall, the two sides and front curtain are 3'. Please adjust sides accordingly to height.**
 - **No attaching materials to curtains!**
 - **Displays should be designed and constructed to withstand the duration of the fair.**
- Exhibits must be different each year and should reflect the theme of the fair.
- **Because of the limited number of booths available, space will be assigned on a first come, first served basis by the date and time the entry was entered online through the fair software system.**
- Participants must come back and break down their booth on **Monday, September 16 from 9am – 7pm.**
 - Materials must be disposed of properly off fairgrounds.
 - **Exhibitors leaving trash behind will forfeit any premiums earned.**
- The NC Mountain State Fair **will not** provide tables or any other supplies for displays.
- All booths judged and awarded honorable mention will receive the premium associated with it.
- There will not be more than one ribbon awarded and one award paid for each placement in a class.

Superintendents or their family members are not eligible to enter exhibits in the department(s) they are overseeing for competition but can be used for Display Only.
