RULES AND REGULATIONS

Please read important information in the front section of this book.

- Homeschoolers need to enter in the individual student art competition.
- Competition is limited to youth living in North Carolina. (Kindergarten through Middle School Grades.)
- Each school in North Carolina is invited to participate. The children’s work should have been done as part of a school assignment within the last year and entered under the school name. Each school can only enter one entry per class based on grades offered at their school. You cannot overlap grade levels to enter both classes. **READ THIS INFORMATION!!! IMPORTANT ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:**
- Each school must submit six (6) individual entries by six (6) different individual students. Artwork should be a variety of techniques and styles. These students’ work should have been done as part of a school assignment within the year starting September 2019-September 2020.
- School entry (all 6 pieces) must be placed on poster boards (or durable backing) with all boards being attached not to exceed 8 feet in height and 4 feet in width. They will be hung for display from a curtain rod. All pieces need to be well secured. **NO SAFETY PINS ALLOWED TO BE USED FOR HANGING ON CURTAINS.**
- All six (6) entries from the participating school should be received in a manner that is easy to handle and identify. List school and class info on the back of each piece of artwork.
- **PREPARATION OF WORK:** Each piece of artwork should be mounted to a full or half standard size piece of poster board or matt (22” x 28”) for hanging. Artwork that is not suitable for hanging will not be judged and may not be displayed. Punch holes in your mat and tie with string (Tape does NOT hold well in humidity). The school name, name of student, grade level and age should be written on the back of the artwork.
- If artwork does not meet the rules and regulations, it will be disqualified.

CRITERIA FOR JUDGING SCHOOL ART:

Overall (Student technical quality, Age appropriate)	= 30
At least 3 quality lessons (using different Media)	= 30
Presentation (Overall presentation of the school art)	= 25
Followed artwork presentations in rule book	= 15
TOTAL = 100	

* **Elementary School** class is for schools: K-4 and K-5

Middle School class is for schools: 5-6, 7-8, and 6-8

Schools having grades K-8 must divide their artwork up according to grades--K-5 (entered as “Elementary”) and 6-8 (entered as “Middle School”).
