RULES AND REGULATIONS

Please read important information in the front section of this book.

- All entries must be the work of the exhibitor.
- All entries must have been completed between September 2020 and September 2022 and must not have won a blue ribbon in any past Mountain State Fair.
- Only three carvings can be entered in each class per carver, although no carver can win more than two premiums in any one individual class.
- No kits or duplicator pieces (intarsia, marquetry, puzzles) will be accepted. Carvings from roughouts are permitted; no scroll saw works will be admitted.
- All entries must be hand carved. Power carvers and dremel type rotary tools may be used.
- All carvings must be of wood. The use of molded feet of wire & putty, and glass eyes is permitted. The use of plastic or molded metallic or any other commercially manufactured parts is not permitted.
- Group carvings - that is, 2 or more pieces mounted on the same base, or as a group not mounted, will be judged as a single carving.
- The Mountain State Fair reserves the right to add, delete, or combine categories and/or classes.
- The Mountain State Fair reserves the right to refuse carvings that it considers not in good taste (i.e., nude figures, hand gestures or illegal controlled substances).
- If an entry is misrepresented or the exhibitor misrepresents his/her status, the entry will be disqualified.
- Any metal supports such as screws, wire and rods should not be visible.

There are 2 categories of entrants: Exhibitor must choose between Amateur and Professional. One CANNOT enter both.

Amateur: A hobbyist; someone who carves for fun, who may occasionally sell a piece.

Professional: An individual who carves to sell his/her pieces, who may teach classes for pay or whose primary income is derived from teaching or selling his/her carvings.

FB001	FB014	Animals - All realistic proportioned in the round carvings of animals; mammals, reptiles, fish, amphibians, and insects.
FB002	FB015	Miniature - Complete carving must fit inside a 2" x 2" x 2" cube. If the carving has a base, the carving and base together must fit within the cube.
FB003	FB016	Birds - All realistic proportioned in the round carving of song birds, birds of prey, upland game birds, ducks, geese, pelicans, swans, loons, shorebirds, poultry, decoys, and any other birds not previously listed.
FB004	FB017	Canes & Walking Sticks - These must not exceed 60" in length and must contain elements that have been carved and/or wood burned not merely barked peeled.
FB005	FB018	Santa's and Yuletide Decorations - Santa's, this includes old world classics or modern examples as well as caricatures. This category also includes, but is not limited to, religious or secular holiday ornaments such as tree ornaments, room decorations, and nativity scenes.
FB006	FB019	Eggs - Carvings based on a fundamental egg shape.
FB007	FB020	Human Figures & Busts - Realistic proportioned carved human forms and busts. Only bottle stopper busts that are realistic proportioned are allowed in this class.
FB008	FB021	Caricatures - All in the round carvings with exaggerated proportions. This includes mythical figures, carousel animals, bottle stopper busts, clowns, animals, birds, humans, cartoon and storybook characters.
FB009	FB022	Relief - Two dimensional carvings in "low" and "high" relief including half round pierced and incised carvings.
FB010	FB023	Found Wood - All carvings utilizing driftwood, knots, tree trunks, limbs or bark.
FB011	FB024	Native American Representation - All items entered to be carved of wood to represent human forms, busts, clothing, bows, knives, pipes, anything that Native Americans made or used to survive. NO CARICATURES! Group carvings will be counted as a single carving; e.g., hunting scenes, camp scenes, home scenes.... Up to 3 carvings may be entered but only 2 ribbons can be awarded to an individual.
FB012	FB025	Pyrography - Pictures or objects burned for design and/or effect.
