JUNIOR TWO-YEAR-OLD COW - Born March 1, 2020 - August 31, 2020

SENIOR TWO-YEAR-OLD COW - Born September 1, 2019 - February 28, 2020

THREE-YEAR-OLD COW - Born September 1, 2018 - August 31, 2019

FOUR-YEAR-OLD COW - Born September 1, 2017 - August 31, 2018

AGED COW - Born before September 1, 2017

DRY COW - Any cow that has completed a lactation regardless of age. To be designated at time of entry and dry at time of show. Not eligible for other classes unless calved before time of show.

BREEDER'S HERD OF FIVE FEMALES - Group of 5 females any age and must be bred by the exhibitor with a maximum of 3 animals that have freshened. Each exhibitor limited to one entry.

PREMIER EXHIBITOR AWARD - The exhibitor winning the most points on not to exceed six animals, and exhibited by himself in the open single classes, shall be designated the Premier Exhibitor. The scale of points will be the same as for determining Premier Breeder. (Banner)

PREMIER BREEDER'S AWARD - The Breeder winning the most points on not to exceed six animals in the open single classes, exhibited by himself and/or other exhibitors, shall be designated the Premier Breeder. (Banner)

The point system for determining Premier Breeder is as follows:

OPEN DAIRY CATTLE SHOW

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Health Regulations of the Veterinary Division of the N.C. Department of Agriculture will be strictly enforced. Be sure to read these under "Rules & Regulations of the Livestock Division" before entering. Animals cannot be unloaded until checked in.
2. Cattle are to be tied on a first come first serve basis regarding spaces. NO motel displays or living spaces allowed. **Feed and hay for a single day use only allowed in barn. NO STOCK PILING ALLOWED.**
3. No companion animals allowed in cattle area. (dogs, cats, etc...)
4. Please note the following rules:
 - A. Only the participants, judges and show personnel will be allowed inside the show ring.
 - B. The Open Dairy Show is judged on type only.
 - C. Any exhibitor removing cattle from the barn before the show is over forfeits all prizes except in special cases determined by the Show Management.
 - D. Exhibitors are expected to wear clean, neat clothing while showing their animals. White shirts and pants are encouraged for the Open Dairy Show.
 - E. All registered animals will be shown in their respective breeds.
 - F. All group classes must be entered under the same exhibitor name or farm name as entered in other classes.
 - G. **Entries in open show must be made in the name of the owner as recorded on registration certificate.**
 - H. **Show harness with Exhibitor ID in it must be worn at all times in show ring.**
 - I. **Exhibitors are not allowed to make substitutions between breeds. A limit of two (2) substitutions per exhibitor may be made per show.**

OPEN JUNIOR DAIRY CATTLE SHOW

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Health Regulations of the Veterinary Division of the N.C. Department of Agriculture will be strictly enforced. Be sure to read these under "Rules & Regulations of the Livestock Division" before entering. Animals cannot be unloaded until checked in.
2. Open to exhibitors ages 21 and under as of January 1 of the current year.
3. No exhibitor in the Junior Dairy Show may show more than three animals.
4. Exhibitors must have personally fitted and cared for the animals 60 or more days prior to the show.
5. All animals must be shown without assistance. Adults, other than the officials, will not be allowed in the ring during the show unless requested by a show official. (Exception: Junior County Herd.)
6. **Registration papers or DHIA calf pages must be presented to the Junior Show superintendent.**
7. Cattle are to be tied on a first come first serve basis regarding spaces. NO motel displays or living spaces allowed. **Feed and hay for a single day use only allowed in barn. NO STOCK PILING ALLOWED.**
8. **One substitution will be allowed only when such substitution replaces an animal which dies, becomes sick, was injured or deleted by the Superintendent. Only one such qualified substitute will be allowed per exhibitor.**
9. Breed and age classification same as listed in Open Dairy Cattle Show.
10. **Show harness with Exhibitor ID in it must be worn at all times in show ring.**

RB280 Costume Class

- A. Any exhibitor in the Junior Dairy Show may participate. The exhibitor may have the assistance of one other junior age person while in the ring. Exhibitors may use any ideas they wish on how to “dress” or “decorate” their dairy animals to represent any personality, place or thing, with emphasis on dairy production. Costumes may consist of any material as long as it is not considered harmful to the animal or potentially harmful to other exhibitors. A 5 - 10 minute period will be allowed for “finishing touches” after the animals enter the ring.
- B. Presence in the show ring constitutes entry in the class.

WNC DISTRICT JUNIOR DAIRY CATTLE SHOW

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Junior Dairy Cattle Shows are sponsored by the WNC Dairy Commission and the WNC Youth Livestock Expo. The WNC Dairy Commission will sponsor ribbons, trophies, and pay all premiums.
2. The Junior Dairy show is open to any youth age 21 and under as of January 1 of the current year and living in Western North Carolina in the counties of Watauga, Caldwell, Burke, Cleveland, Catawba, Lincoln, Alexander, and all counties west.
3. Cattle are to be tied on a first come first serve basis regarding spaces. NO motel displays or living spaces allowed.
Feed and hay for a single day use only allowed in barn. NO STOCK PILING ALLOWED.
4. The Health Regulations of the Veterinary Division of the N.C. Department of Agriculture will be strictly enforced. Be sure to read these under “Rules & Regulations of the Livestock Division” before entering. Animals cannot be unloaded until checked in.
 - A. Any exhibitor removing cattle from the barn before the show is over forfeits all prizes except in special cases determined by the steering committee.
 - B. The exhibitor must have worked with the animal a minimum of one week in order to be eligible to show.
 - C. Exhibitors are expected to wear clean, neat clothing while showing their animals. 4-H and FFA members may wear their respective attire. White shirts and appropriate pants are acceptable.
 - D. Each Junior dairy cattle exhibitor can show a maximum of three animals and can bring an extra animal to clip. These animals can be in any combination of calves, yearlings or cows as long as they are in separate classes.
 - E. **One substitution will be allowed only when such substitution replaces an animal which dies, becomes sick, was injured or deleted by the Superintendent.**
 - F. The decision of the WNC Dairy Show Rules Committee on any questions will be final.
 - G. Registration papers or DHIA calf pages must be presented to the Junior Show Superintendent. Grade animals

must have a DHIA calf page in order to be shown. These animals must have some type of identification that management can use to verify birth dates.

- H. Breed and age classifications same as listed in Open Dairy Cattle Show.
 - I. **The WNC Dairy Commission will pay premiums for WNC District Junior Dairy Show Clipping & Fitting, Showmanship, and type classes.**
 - J. The judge shall have the right not to award a first place premium if no animal merits the placement.
5. A rotating WNC Herdsmanship Trophy will be awarded to the county designated by an anonymous committee of dairy business people. This trophy will be the responsibility of the WNC Dairy Commission.
 6. No exhibitor in the WNC District Junior Dairy Show may show more than three animals.
 7. **Show harness with Exhibitor ID in it must be worn at all times in show ring.**

CLIPPING AND FITTING - WNC DISTRICT JUNIOR DAIRY SHOW

CLASS

RD466 Clipping and Fitting Contest and Showing Class

1. Youth age eligibility – ages 21 and under as of January 1 of the current year.
2. Any female dairy (cattle) animal of any age may be used. However, it should be washed before the contest begins.
Stock that has been clipped within 60 days of the show shall not be used.
3. **Scoring:** Give actual points earned (0-100) for all participants. Judges make notes on animals before starting clipping and fitting, then again at end of contest (one hour and fifteen minutes time will be allocated for the contest) No clipping is to be done before the contest begins.
4. The Clipping and Fitting Contest will count half (50%) of the total score. The other 50% will come from a class of fitting showing, which will immediately follow the results of the Clipping and Fitting Contest. The same animal is to be used for both events.
5. Contestants should take everything they need into the contest area. They will not be allowed to go out and talk to anyone or get additional equipment. Moderate talking among contestants will be allowed; however, no harassment

or communications relative to fitting instructions will be allowed. Any contestant, parent or others breaking these rules may result in disqualification.

6. Animals used in clipping and fitting may or may not be used in other WNC shows.
7. Trophies and/or ribbons will be the responsibility of the WNC Dairy Commission.
8. A \$250.00 Little Mountaineer Scholarship will be given by the WNC Dairy Commission to the exhibitor **living within the WNC District** with the highest total score in the Clipping and Fitting contest, provided the exhibitor has not received the scholarship previously. In case of a tie, a show-off will take place.
9. Exhibitors living outside of the District may participate in the Fitting and Clipping Contest and will be eligible for premiums but ineligible for the Little Mountaineer Scholarship.
